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### New Year Celebrations at PGIM

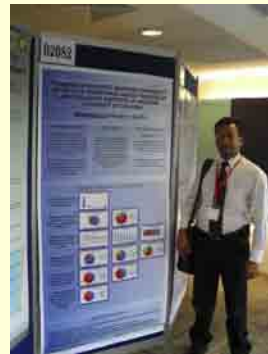

### MERC Researches Presented at the 7<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Medical Education Conference (APMEC)

The 7<sup>th</sup> Asia Pacific Medical Education Conference (APMEC) was held at the National University of Singapore, Singapore from 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> February 2010. This conference was themed **Excellence in Medical Education, Quality in Healthcare - Trends, Issues, Priorities, Strategies (TIPS)**.

Five researches which were conducted by the Medical Education Resource Centre were presented at this conference. Prof Rezvi Sherrif (Director-PGIM), Dr.Pandula Siribaddana (Lecturer in Medical Education) and the Pre-intern Demonstrators at MERC, Dr. Dhananjan Rubasinghe and Dr.Sanlakshi Liyanagama attended this conference, presenting their research. The conference focused to share and learn, from the experience and best practices followed internationally. Nearly 800 medical and health professionals from 34 countries participated in this Conference. Several invited distinguished medical and health professional educators contributed this

The final examination for the first intake of the Postgraduate Diploma in Critical Care Medicine held from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> March 2010. Dr.Malcolm Wright, Emeritus Consultant in Intensive Care and Intensivist, participated as a foreign examiner in the 14 member examiners board for the final exam. All 23 trainees who followed the one year diploma successfully completed and they were reverted

back to Ministry of health for their placements.

**DFM Online**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of trainees for the DFM Online study programme was selected and enrolled in November 2010. The inauguration and orientation session for this new intake was held on the 20<sup>th</sup> of November 2010. The new trainees were introduced to the Moodle system and were guided through the website on which the programme operates.



The MERC commenced a series of workshops in order to train new online tutor mentors for the DFM Online programme. We received an enthusiastic response to this decision by prospective tutor mentors. The first of these workshops was held on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February 2010 with 10 new tutor mentors undergoing training. Dr Gayathri Jayatillaka (Certified Online Tutor Mentor Trainer and Senior Lecturer of the OUSL), Prof Nandani de Silva, Dr Joel Fernando, Dr Deepama Sumanasekera and Dr Sanlakshi Liyanagama participated as resource persons.

The second & third workshops of this series is planned to be held on April & May 2010. The tutor mentors who complete their training satisfactorily, will be awarded with certificates by the PGIM and CPD points according to the National CPD Programme of the SLMA.

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**Inauguration of the Postgraduate Certificate in Medical Education course - 2010 intake**

The Postgraduate Certificate in Medical Education commenced its successful second batch on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2010. This will be a six months part time course which will lead to the Postgraduate Certificate In Medical Education course at its successful completion.
