MD (ORAL SURGERY) EXAMINATION – FEBRUARY, 2015 (Prospectus 2006)

1. The above examination will commence on **18th February, 2015.**
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the examination.

1. MS (Dental Surgery) Part I *and*
2. satisfactory completion of the 2 years training period as prescribed by the regulation.

Note :-

A certificate/s from the trainer Consultant/s certifying satisfactory completion of the in-service training programme of 2 years after Part I, should be submitted with the application.

3. The examination will consist of 6 components. There are two theory papers, one practical (with two components viz oral surgery and oral pathology), two clinicals and a viva voce examination.
4. The close marking scheme will be adopted with a range from 7 to 10 marks with 9 as the pass mark. In order to pass the examination a candidate must score a minimum of 9 for each of the 6 components and a total of 54 marks in the above 6 components.
5. Past question papers are available for sale in the PGIM Library or can be downloaded from our website www.cmb.ac.lk/pgim..
6. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD (Oral Surgery) examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequent scheduled examination for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study the examination will be counted as an attempt.
7. Please note that candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the Part II which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of passing the Part I or equivalent examination to the said qualification. This requirement does not apply to those candidates who have sat the MS (Dental Surgery) Part I examination before 1998.
8. The allocation of Post MD training units will be done as described in “Guidelines for enrolment of non-state sector trainees in to PGIM training programmes-2011 and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.
9. The candidates should commence the overseas training within five years after passing the MD Examination and if not the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
10. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly

11. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

12. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after January 2010 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

13. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

14. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows :-

(a) Application fee	- Rs. 1,000.00
(b) Registration fee	- Rs. 4,000.00 (non refundable)
(c) Examination fees	- Rs. 40,000.00

(Private candidates will be charged 50% more on fees stated above.)

15. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 1000/-. It also can be downloaded from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk for which Rs. 1000/- should be paid together with other payments to the Bank. Requests for application and other details by post should accompany a SASE 9" x 4" in size and a money order for Rs. 1000/- drawn in favour of Postgraduate Institute of Medicine and payable at the Cinnamon Gardens Post Office, Colombo 7. The envelope should be marked "**Application for MD (Oral Surgery)**" at the top left hand corner.

16. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Professor Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha (Norris Canal Road), Colombo 7 on or before **5th January, 2015. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

17. There shall be no repeat or additional examinations which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2015.

18. The unofficial results of the examination will be only released following approval by the Board of Management. However for the results to be valid and official the **Senate of the University should approve the results.**

19. The candidates will be issued an "**Examination Feedback Form**" with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination.** If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
