**MSc (COMMUNITY MEDICINE/COMMUNITY DENTISTRY) EXAMINATIONS –
NOVEMBER, 2015 (PROSPECTUS - 2009)**

1. The above examination will commence on **Thursday, 26 November, 2015**.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical/dental officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination.
 - successfully completed the training programme conducted by the Board of Study in Community Medicine, PGIM with 80% satisfactory attendance.

Note:- Candidates are required to submit along with the application, the final title of dissertation and name/s of Supervisor/s.

1. The MSc (Community Medicine) examination consists of four components, Written Papers/Clinical/Viva Voce and Dissertation. A candidate should obtain 50% for written papers, 45% for clinical, 45% for viva voce, 50% for dissertation and 50% total aggregate to pass the exam.
4. The MSc (Community Dentistry) examination consists of four components, Written Papers/Practical/Viva Voce and Dissertation. A candidate should obtain 50% for written papers, 45% for practical, 45% for viva voce, 50% for dissertation and 50% total aggregate to pass the exam.
5. Please note that **candidates are allowed 6 attempts which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination**. This requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/Part I examinations before 1998. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo further training for a minimum period of one year before being permitted to sit the sixth attempt.
6. **Also please note that the MSc. in Community Medicine / Community Dentistry Examination under the old syllabus – 2009 prospectus will be held only until the year 2016. Therefore, trainees who joined the programme under this prospectus and the unsuccessful candidates have to sit and complete the examination within this period. No attempt will be allowed to any trainee/candidate under the old prospectus after year 2016.**
7. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus.

8. The successful candidates who will decide to register for the MD training programme should undergo 2 years Post MD training (1 year local and 1 year overseas) to be eligible for Board certification.

09. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be, as follows :

(a) Registration fee	- Rs.	4,000.00 (Non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs.	26,000.00
(c) Assessment fee of dissertation	- Rs.	4,000.00

(Private candidates will be charged 50% more on each fee of the PGIM)

10. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 1000/-. The application form also could be downloaded from our website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/> on payment of Rs. 1000/-. The envelope should be marked “**Application for MSc (Community Medicine/Community Dentistry) Examination 2015 (Prospectus – 2009)**” at the top left hand corner.

11. Applications **with every cage duly filled** should be forwarded to the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, PGIM, 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before **23 October, 2015** through the Head of Department/Course Coordinator. **Late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

12 .Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

13. There shall be no repeat or additional examinations which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2015.

1. The results will be valid and official only after they are approved by the Senate of the University of Colombo.

15. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination.** If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
