MSc (HUMAN NUTRITION) EXAMINATION – JANUARY -2016

1. The above examination will commence on **5th January 2016**.The examination will be held in Colombo.
2. Applications for above examination are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements.
 - Successfully completed the training programme conducted by the Board of Study in Community Medicine, PGIM with 80% satisfactory attendance in,
 - a. The classes conducted in of the 10 modules in taught course
 - b. The period of clinical/practical training
 - c. The weekly classes conducted during the period of clinical/practical training
 - Submission of satisfactory progress reports acceptable to the Board of Study in Community Medicine.
 - Submission of duly completed portfolio on or before **30th November 2015**.
3. The end of course examination shall consist of four parts.
 - Theory Examination – MCQ & SEQ
 - Objective Structured Practical Examination (OSPE)
 - Assessment of the Portfolio
 - Portfolio based Viva
4. To pass the examination a candidate should obtain:

A minimum total aggregate of 50% for all component of the exam and
A minimum of 45% for the theory component (MCQ & SEQ) and
A minimum of 45% for the practical component (OSPE) and
A minimum of 45% for the assessment of portfolio
A minimum of 25% for the Portfolio based viva
5. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MSc examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reason not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be considered as an attempts.
6. Please note that **candidates are allowed 6 attempts only in the MSc which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination**. This requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/Part I examination before 1998. However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.

7. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows:

| (c) Assessment fee of portfolio | - Rs. 2,000.00 |

(Private candidates will be charged 50% more on each fee of the PGIM)

8. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 1000/- The application forms from also could be downloaded from our website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/> on payment of Rs.1000/-
9. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded to the Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, No. 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before **4th December 2015** through the Head of Department / Course Coordinator.
10. Applications will be entertained only subjecting to submitting the complete portfolio on or before **30th of November 2015**. **Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances**
11. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers to Department of Health in MOH website – www.health.gov.lk
12. Please bring the contents of the Circular to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.
13. There shall be no repeat or additional examinations which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2015.
14. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
15. The candidates will be issued an **“Examination Feedback Form”** with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination**. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
