SELECTION EXAMINATION FOR MD (OBSTETRICS & GYNAECOLOGY)
-JANUARY, 2016

1. The above examination will commence on **28th January 2016**.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the examination.
 - (a) a medical degree registered *with the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
 - (b) Satisfactory completion of internship acceptable to the Sri Lanka Medical Council ;
 - (c) Satisfactory completion of one year of post internship in medical/clinical practice in a University/Public Sector/Private Sector Institution in Sri Lanka acceptable to the PGIM as at the date of closure of applications, ie **28th December 2015**.
 - (d) Have six (6) months of experience in Obstetrics and Gynaecology as a pre-officer under the supervision of a specialist Obstetrician and Gynaecologist.
 - (e) Produce a medical certificate from a specialist physician, to confirm general mental and physical fitness
 - (f) Comply with any other PGIM regulations

Note:

A certificate from the Consultant, stating the completion of 06 months Clinical appointment in Obstetrics and Gynaecology must be submitted along with the application form.

The criteria prescribed in paragraph(c) have to be satisfied by the applicants by the date of closure of applications. Where a short-fall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examination.

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3. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the selection examination. The current format of the selection examination for the perusal of applicants is described in the prospectus 2012 and relevant examination documents which are available at the PGIM.

4. The selection examination shall consist of a MCQ paper, Theory Paper and SOA. MCQ paper with 60 questions(40 true/false type MCQ & EMQs with 20 items of three hours duration) Theory paper with 5 questions of three hours duration a Structured Oral Assessment with 6 stations of one hour duration. Candidates will have to obtain 50% or more in the EMQ/MCQ Paper to proceed to the rest of the examination which is scheduled to be held on 29th February and 02nd March 2016.

5. The candidate should obtain an **aggregate of 50%** or more of the total (225 or more out of 450) **and**

50% or more for the MCQ paper (75 out 150) **and**

50% or more for the Theory Paper (75 out of 150) **and**

50% or more for the SOA (75 out of 150)

6. **Up to a maximum of 20(Twenty)Candidates** from the **Ministry of Health (MOH)** who pass the Selection Examination will be enrolled in the training programme. The **20th MOH candidate's marks will be taken as a cut-off line and the candidates in sections 07, 08 and 09 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.**

7. All candidates from the **Non-State Sector** who pass the selection examination and **“who are above the cut-off line”** will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.

8. All candidates from the **State Universities** who pass the selection examination and **“who are above the cut-off line”** will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.

9. All candidates from the **Armed Forces** who pass the selection examination and **“who are above the cut-off line”** will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.

10. The candidates who pass the selection examination according to the criteria prescribed in 5 shall only be considered to enrolment to the course.

11. The allocation of training units will be done as described in “ General Regulation & Guidelines 2016” which is available on PGIM website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/> The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.

12. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.

13. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrollment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health or University.

14. The relevant information of the training program, MD Examination, requirements for Board Certification are described in the Prospectus and other relevant documents. However if amendments have been made following printing of the Prospectus the circulars with such amendments may be collected from the examinations branch office of the PGIM. These circulars will also be handed over to the selected candidates at the commencement of the training programme.

15. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

16. The candidates who shall commence the pre MD (Registrar) or Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre- Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

17. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

18. Following the complement of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

19. The prescribed fees for the examination for candidates in the state sector as follows :-

(a) Registration fee	- Rs. 4 000/= (Non Refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs. 27,500/=

(Candidates from non state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Candidates are required to pay Rs.4,000/= the registration and Rs.17,000/- the examination fee for the MCQ/EMQ paper, at the first instance. Those who qualify the MCQ Examination will have to pay the balance examination fee of Rs.10,500/- in order to proceed for the rest of the examination.

20. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs.1,000/-. The application form also could be downloaded from our website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/> on payment of 1,000/-..

21. Completed applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department, confirming that the applicants if selected would be released for postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before **28th December 2015**. **Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

22. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.

23. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health website – www.health.gov.lk/

24. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

25. The candidates will be issued an **“Examination Feedback Form”** with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination**. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.

26. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

27. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo a training module on Professionalism organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is a compulsory module for all MD trainees and should be completed within first two years of pre MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who follow this module.
