MD (ANAESTHESIOLOGY) PART IB (BASIC SCIENCES) EXAMINATION – JANUARY/MARCH 2017

1. The above examination is scheduled to commence on **20th January 2017**.

2. Applications are invited from medical officers in the state and non-state sectors possessing the following requirements to sit the MD (Anaesthesiology) Part IB Examination.

- (a) A medical degree registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
- (b) satisfactory completion of internship acceptable to the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
- (c) satisfactory completion of one year of post internship in medical/ clinical practice in a University/Public Sector Institution /Private sector in Sri Lanka acceptable to the PGIM as at the date of closure of applications, ie. 19th December 2016; and
- (d) any other requirement/s stipulated by the Board of Study concerned that has/have been approved by the Board of Management.

Notes :-

- i. The criteria prescribed in paragraph (c) must have been satisfied by the applicants as at the date of closure of applications provided that where a short-fall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examinations.
- ii. Candidates successful at the examination will be registered as PG trainees for the Part II in-service training programme provided they have successfully completed the MD (Anaesthesiology) Part IA.

3. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the MD (Anaesthesiology) Part IA & Part IB examinations. The current format of the Part IB examination for the perusal of applications is described in the prospectus 2009 and relevant examination documents which are available at the PGIM.

4. In the MD (Anaesthesiology) Part IB (Basic Sciences) Examination, subjects of Physiology, Pharmacology and Physics & Clinical Measurements shall be assessed. In each Subject there shall be 3 components. i.e. Multiple Choice Question (MCQ) paper, Essay Type Question paper and Oral examination.

5. Candidates should first obtain a minimum closed mark of 2 (50%) or more for the MCQ paper in each of the three subjects (Prospectus 2009 page 3) in order to proceed for the rest of the examination which will commence on 10^{th} March 2017. All candidates will be informed in writing, their performance at the MCQ paper.

6. The candidate who pass the Part IB examination by obtaining minimum individual closed mark of 2,2,2,2,2,1+ in each of the six separate components in the Essay type Question paper and Oral examination of the three subjects only shall be considered to enroll for the course.

7. 30 Candidates from the Ministry of Health (MOH) who pass the Part IB Examination as prescribed in Section 6 will be enrolled in the training programme. Placements will be made purely in the order of merit. The details are available at the Examination Branch office of the PGIM and on the PGIM website under "General Regulations and Guidelines 2016". The 30th MOH candidate's marks will be taken as a cut-off line and the candidates in sections 9, 10 and 11 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.

8. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.

9. All candidates from **State Universities** who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.

10. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including Police**) who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.

11. All **Non-State Sector** candidates who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme. They will be placed below the order of merit for candidates from the MOH, State Universities and Armed Forces (including Police) based on the merit within the non-state sector category.

12. Following the examination and release of results the above numbers shall not be changed nor shall requests for such changes be entertained.

13. Each year only the scheduled Selection Examinations in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examinations will be held.

14. The allocation of training units will be done as described in "General Regulation & Guidelines 2016" which is available on PGIM website <u>http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/</u> The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.

15. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.

16. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. It may be necessary to sign a bond before enrollment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health or University.

17. The relevant information of the training program, MD Examination, requirements for Board Certification are described in the Prospectus and other relevant documents. However if amendments have been made following printing of the Prospectus the circulars with such amendments may be collected from the Examinations Branch office of the PGIM. These circulars will also be handed over to the selected candidates at the commencement of the training programme.

18. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

19. The candidates who shall commence the pre MD (Registrar) or Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre- Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

20. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

21. Following the complement of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

22. The prescribed fees for the examination for candidates in the state sector as follows :-

(a) Registration fee	- Rs.	4 000/= (Non Refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs.	21 000/=

(Candidates from non state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Candidates are required to pay Rs.4,000/= the registration and Rs.10,500/- the examination fee for the MCQ paper, at the first instance. Those who qualify the MCQ Examination will have to pay the balance examination fee of Rs.10,500/- in order to proceed for the rest of the examination.

23. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs.1,000/-. The application form also could be downloaded from our website <u>www.cmb.ac.lk/pgim</u> on payment of 1,000/-.

24. Completed applications with every cage duly filled should be forwarded through the Head of Department, confirming that the applicants if selected would be released for postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine,160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before 19th December 2016. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.

25. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection.

26. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

27. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health website – <u>www.health.gov.lk/</u>

28. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

29. The candidates will be issued an "<u>Examination Feedback Form</u>" with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover <u>within 48</u> <u>hours after conclusion of the examination</u>. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. No complaints or concerns regarding the examination of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.

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30. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo a training module on Professionalism organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is a compulsory module for all MD trainees and should be completed within first two years of pre MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who follow this module.
