SELECTION EXAMINATION IN MD (COMMUNITY MEDICINE) – MARCH , 2016

- 01. The above examination will commence on **30th March, 2016.** The examination will be held in Colombo.
- 02. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirement to sit the above examination:
 - successfully completed the MSc (Community Medicine)
- 03. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the selection examination. The current format of the selection examination for the perusal of applicants is described in the prospectus 2015 and relevant examination documents which are available at the PGIM.
- 04. The examination shall consist of One component i.e. One Written Paper with two Structured Essay Questions of one hour duration.
- 05. A Candidate has to obtain a minimum of 45% marks for each question with an aggregate of 50% in order to qualify for Selection Examination.
- 06. All successful Candidates of the Selection MD examination, will be eligible to register for the MD training programme in Community Medicine.
- 07. Each year only the scheduled Selection Examination in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examinations will be held.
- 08. The allocation of training units will be done as described in "General regulations & Guide lines 2016" and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.
- 09. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another eligible candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.
- 10. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrollment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health or University.

- 11. The relevant information of the training programme, MD Examination requirements for Board Certification is described in the <u>Prospectus 2015</u> and in other relevant documents. However if amendments have been made following printing of the Prospectus, the circulars with such amendments may be collected from the examination branch office of the PGIM. These circulars will also be handed over to the selected candidates at the commencement of the training programme.
- 12. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August, 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
- 13. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period if required as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly
- 14. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows :-

(a) Registration fee	- Rs.	4,000.00 (Non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs.	11,500.00

- 15. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 1000/-. The application form also could be downloaded from the website http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/ on payment of Rs. 1000/-.
- 16. Completed applications with every cage duly filled should be forwarded through the Head of Department, confirming that the applicants if selected would be released for postgraduate training in the PGIM. The envelope should be marked "Application for selection in MD (Community Medicine) March 2016" at the top left hand corner. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before 14th March 2016. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.
- 17. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.
- 18. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.
- 19. Please refer to the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website <u>www.health.gov.lk</u>
- 20. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

- 21. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
- 22. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo a training module on professionalism organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is a compulsory module for all MD trainees and should be completed within first two years of pre MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who follow this module.
