MD (DERMATOLOGY) EXAMINATION – JANUARY, 2017

1. The above examination will commence on **30th January, 2017**. The examination will be held in Colombo.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination.
 - (a) Candidate must successfully complete the assessment I
 - (b) Candidate must successfully complete the assessment II
 - (c) Candidate must successfully complete one year period of training in Advanced and Applied Dermatology.
 - (d) Satisfactory progress reports from the trainers.
3. The MD (Dermatology examination shall consist of Four components. ie **Written component** (Essay paper, Structured Essay Paper) **OSCE, Clinical Component** (Long Case, Short Cases) and **Viva Voce**
4. In order to pass the MD examination, a candidate should obtain 60% or more from the final total mark and 60% or more for written examination and 60% or more for Objective Structured Clinical Examination and 60% or more for the clinical examination. In the event a candidate obtains 60% or more for the written examination and fails the clinical components (OSCE and Clinical Cases) he or she can be exempted from the theory paper for a maximum number of two more attempts or for a maximum period of two years whichever occurs earlier from the date of commencement of the examination where the candidate passed the theory component.
5. These candidates are required to submit a fresh application together with a letter indicating whether they would sit again for the theory component or wish to appear only for the clinical and viva components of the examination before the closing date of applications. Candidates who opt for the clinical and viva need to pay the registration fee of Rs. 4,000/-and Rs. 22,000.00/-as the examination fees.
6. Past question papers are available for sale in the PGIM Library.
7. Candidates who are eligible to sit for the MD Part II examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examination will be counted as an attempt.

8. Please note that **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the Part II which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of first examination.** This requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/ Part I examinations before 1998. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training in a different training center before being permitted to sit for the sixth attempt.
9. The allocation of post MD training units will be done as described in “General Regulations and Guidelines -2016” and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons
10. The candidates should commence the overseas training within five years after passing the MD Examination and if not the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
11. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
12. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
13. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
14. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
15. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows :-

(a) Registration fee	- Rs. 4,000/= (non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs. 44,000/=

(Candidates from non state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)
16. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 1000/-. The application form also could be downloaded from our website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/> on payment of Rs. 1000/-.
17. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department confirming that the applicant if selected would be released for Postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Senior Asst. Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before **27th December 2016.**
Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.

18. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in PGIM website.
19. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.
20. There shall be no repeat or additional examinations which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2017.
21. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
22. The Candidate will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the appointment letter and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination**. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
