**SELECTION EXAMINATION FOR MD (FORENSIC MEDICINE) –
JANUARY, 2017**

1. The above examination will commence on 27th January 2017.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers in the state and non-state sectors possessing the following requirements to sit the Selection Examination in MD (Forensic Medicine).
 - (a) Hold a medical degree and be registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
 - (b) Completion of internship recognized by the Sri Lanka Medical Council ;
 - (c) Completed one year work experience in Sri Lanka in the medical field after internship acceptable to the Board of Study ;
 - (d) The criteria prescribed in paragraphs (a) to (c) must have been fulfilled by the applicant as at the date of closure of applications for the selection examination;
 - (e) Produce a medical certificate from a specialist physician to confirm general mental and physical fitness :
 - (f) Comply with any other PGIM regulations.

Foreign nationals who seek to apply to sit the selection examination should possess a medical degree registrable with the Sri Lankan Medical Council.

3. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the selection examination. The current format of the selection examination for the perusal of applicants is described in the prospectus 2017 and relevant examination documents which are available at the PGIM.

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4. The examination shall consist of 2 components, i.e. theory paper and objective structured practical examination :-

(a) Theory Paper : MCQ Paper with 30 multiple choice questions of the true/false type, 15 Single Best Answer (SBA) questions and 15 extended matching questions ;

and

(b) Objective Structured Practical Examination – 10 OSPE Stations
(60 minutes)

5. In order to pass the examination a candidate should obtain a total overall mark of 50% or more, and a mark of 40% or more in each of the two components of the examination.
6. **16 candidates** from the **Ministry of Health (MOH)** who pass the Selection examination will be enrolled in the training programme. Placements will be made purely in the order of merit. The details are available at the Examination Branch office of the PGIM and on the PGIM website under “General Regulations and Guidelines 2015”. The 16th MOH candidate’s marks will be taken as a cut-off line and the candidates in sections 8,9 and 10 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.
7. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.
8. All candidates from **State Universities** who are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.
9. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including Police)** who are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.
10. All **Non-State Sector** candidates who are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme. They will be placed below the order of merit for candidates from the MOH, State Universities and **Armed Forces(including Police)** based on merit within the non-sector category.
11. Following the examination and release of results the above numbers shall not be changed nor shall requests for such changes be entertained.
12. Each year only the scheduled Selection Examination in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examinations will be held.
13. The Allocation of training units will be done as described in “General Regulations & Guidelines – 2016” and according to the approval procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.
14. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another eligible candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.

15. For all full time training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrolment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health or University.

16. The relevant information of the training programme, MD Examination, requirements for Board Certification are described in the prospectus 2017 and other relevant documents. However if amendments have been made following printing of the prospectus. The circulars with such amendments may be collected from the examination branch office of the PGIM. These circulars will also be handed over to the selected candidates at the commencement of the training programme.

17. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialities and the information is available in the prospectus.

18. The candidates who shall commence the Pre MD(Registrar) or Post MD(Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

19. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

20. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows:-

- (a) Registration fee - Rs. 5,000.00
- (b) Examination fee - Rs. 32,000.00
- (c) Application fee - Rs. 2,000.00

(Candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

21. Eligible candidates should obtain the prescribed application forms from the Examinations Branch, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine on payment of Rs. 2000/-or can be downloaded from our website www.cmb.ac.lk/pgim.

22 Applications with every cage duly filled should be forwarded through the Head of Department, to the Asst. Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 7 on or before 10th January 2017. **Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

23 Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in website – www.health.gov.lk

24 Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

25 The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.

26 The results will be valid and official only after they are approved by the **Senate of the University Colombo.**

27 The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. It should be sent to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination**. If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination of following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.**

28 Candidates who pass the selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo a training module on professionalism organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is a compulsory module for all MD trainees and should be completed within first two years of pre MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who follow this module.
