MSc (COMMUNITY MEDICINE) EXAMINATION – NOVEMBER, 2017
(PROSPECTUS - 2013)

1. The above examination will commence on **Tuesday, 28th November 2017**.
2. Applications are invited from MSc (Community Medicine) trainees who have satisfied the following criteria:
 - a. Satisfactory completion of one year training
 - b. Attendance of more than 80% for each of the modules
 - c. Satisfactory completion of Log Book and acceptance by the BOS
 - d. Duly completed portfolio which is acceptable to the BOS
 - e. Completion of all the assignments
3. The MSc (Community Medicine) examination consists of four components,
 - Written Papers (Theory)
 - Clinical
 - In-course Assessments
 - Dissertation
4. Please note that candidates are allowed 6 attempts which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination.
5. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be, as follows :

(a) Registration fee	- Rs.	5,000.00 (Non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs.	30,000.00
(c) Assessment fee of dissertation	- Rs.	5,000.00 (Non refundable)

(Private candidates are required to pay 50% more)
- ❖ **Only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted.**
6. The application form can be downloaded from the website www.cmb.ac.lk/pgim on payment of Rs. 2000/-.

7. The applications **with every cage duly filled** should be forwarded to the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, PGIM, 160, Prof Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before **20th October 2017** through the Head of Department/Course Coordinator. **Late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.** The envelope should be marked "Application for MSc (Community Medicine) Examination 2017 (Prospectus – 2013)" at the top left hand corner.
8. There shall be **no repeat or additional examinations** which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2017.
9. The results will be valid after confirmation by the Senate of the University
10. The candidates will be issued an "**Examination Feedback Form**" with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination.** If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
