POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN ANATOMY EXAMINATION II (MODULES 5,6,7 & 8) – FEBRUARY/MARCH 2020

- 1. The above modules examination will commence on 29th February 2020
- 2. Applications are invited by me up to 10th February 2020 from medical/dental officers possessing the following eligibility requirements to sit the above Modules.

A minimum of 80% attendance at each of the components – lectures, tutorials and practicals.

Note: A candidate who fails to obtain 80% attendance without a valid reason should complete the requirement and sit the next available examination.

3. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follow: -

(a) Application fee - Rs. 2,500/= (b) Registration fee - Rs. 6,000/= (a) Examination fee - Rs. 16,000/=

(Only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM) (Private candidates will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

- 4. The application form can be downloaded from the website http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk
- 5. The above examination will consist of Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) Paper, Essay Paper, Structured Essay Questions (SEQ) Paper, and Objectively Structured Practical Examination (OSPE) components.
- 6. In order to pass a module a grade C or above should be obtained.
- 7. The results will be valid and official only after they are approved by the **Senate of the University of Colombo.**
- 8. Applications with every cage duly filled should be forwarded through the Head of Department. The applications should reach the Senior Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, PGIM. No. 160, Professor Nandadasa Kodagoda Mw, Colombo 7 on or before 10th February 2020. The envelope should be marked "Application for Postgraduate Diploma in Anatomy Examination II" at the top left hand corner incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.

- 9. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
