## **COURSE IN BASIC LABORATORY SCIENCES EXAMINATION – JUNE 2017**

1. The above examination is scheduled to commence on **20 June 2017.** 

2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following minimum requirements to sit the Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences Examination.

- (a) A minimum of 80% attendance during the training period; and
- (b) A report of satisfactory completion of the training programme certified by the Trainer Supervisor.

3. The examination shall consist of 60 multiple choice questions to be answered in 3 hours. Candidates need to obtain a minimum of 50% to pass the Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences (CBLS) Examination.

4. Those who are not successful at the CBLS examination could also proceed with the Postgraduate Diploma training. However, such trainees need to pass the CBLS examination to be eligible to sit the Postgraduate Diploma examination in the respective disciplines.

5. Candidates are allowed a maximum of three (03) attempts at the CBLS examination. Those who are unsuccessful at the  $03^{rd}$  attempt will have to leave the training programme.

6. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows:

a) Application fee	-	Rs. 2,000.00 (non refundable)
b) Registration fee	-	Rs. 5,000.00 (non refundable)
b) Examination fees	-	Rs.13,500.00

## Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted.

7. The application form can be downloaded from the website <u>http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk/</u> on payment of Rs. 2000/-. The envelope should be marked "**Application for Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences Examination** at the top left hand corner. Applications with every cage duly filled should be forwarded through the Head of the Department. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, PGIM. No. 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before 19 May 2017. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.
