MD (FORENSIC MEDICINE) EXAMINATION – MAY 2019

1. The above examination will commence on **27th May 2019**.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination:
 - (a) Have passed the DLM examination conducted by the PGIM or an equivalent postgraduate medical degree and training in Forensic Medicine acceptable by the Board of Study and approved by the Board of Management.
 - (b) Have successfully completed 2 years in-service training of which one year should have been in a Department of Forensic Medicine of a University and one year in a JMO's office approved by the Board of Study after obtaining the qualification at (a) above.
 - (c) Candidates to be eligible for enrollment for the examination must submit a case book comprising of 10 cases of which 4 cases should be in Clinical Forensic Medicine and 6 cases in Forensic Pathology. Only those candidates whose Case Books have been accepted and approved will be permitted to attempt the examination.
 - (d) At the end of the training period, the trainee shall obtain a certificate of satisfactory completion of the training from each of the trainers which is a pre-requisite to sit the examination.
 - (e) The trainee shall maintain a Log book provided by the PGIM, which must be submitted along with the application to sit the MD examination.
 - (f) candidates are required to submit **Professionalism and Ethics in Medical Practice Strand Certificate** issued by the PGIM.
3. The examination will consist of,
 - (a) Written Paper I & Paper II
 - (b) Postmortem
 - (c) Clinical examination
 - (d) OSPE
 - (e) Histopathology
 - (f) Orals

Candidates must obtain a minimum of 50% in each of the above components to be successful at the examination.

4. Past question papers are available for sale in the PGIM Library.
5. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examination will be counted as an attempt.
6. Please note that **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the MD examination which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination.** This requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/Part I examinations before 1998. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.
7. The allocation of Post MD training units will be done as described in “General Regulations and Guidelines – 2019” and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.
8. The candidates should commence the overseas training within five years after passing the MD Examination and if not the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
9. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after January 2010 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
10. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
11. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for the Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
12. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

13. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows:-

Only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted.

14. The application form can be downloaded from the website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk.
15. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department, to the Snr. Asst. Registrar/ Examinations, PGIM. No. 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mw., Colombo 7 on or before **13th May 2019**. The envelope should be marked "Application for the MD(Forensic Medicine) Examination" at the top left hand corner.
16. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website – www.health.gov.lk
17. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.
18. There shall be **no repeat or additional examinations** which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar for the year 2019.
19. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the **Senate of the University of Colombo**.
20. The candidates will be issued an "**Examination Feedback Form**" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. Perceived biases, discriminatory behavior, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.**
