**MD (CLINICAL ONCOLOGY) PART II EXAMINATION (PROSPECTUS -2012) –
SEPTEMBER 2017**

1. The above examination will commence on **Friday 15th September 2017**.
2. Applications are invited from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination.

- (a) Successful completion of Part I Clinical Oncology examination ;
- (b) Participated and satisfactorily completed the Stage II Training programmes.
- (c) Submission and acceptance of all progress reports and Peer Team Review reports. In case of unsatisfactory report/s from the trainer/s, the BOS/ Clinical Oncology would take appropriate actions according to the General PGIM rules and regulations
- (d) Submission of a case book 6 months prior to the date of commencement of the MD part 2 examination and acceptance of the same by the Board of Study in Clinical Oncology.

3. The MD (Clinical Oncology) Part II examination shall consist of seven components (labeled C1 to C7) Covering the subjects in Clinical Oncology i.e

C1-	Paper I	Short Essay Type Question paper of 2 hrs duration
C2-	Paper II	Structured Essay Type Question paper of 3 hrs duration
C3-	Paper III	Structured Essay Type Question paper of 3 hrs duration
C4-	Clinicals	Long Case (45 minutes for examination and 30 minutes for the discussion)
C5-	Clinicals	Short Cases (Two panels & 30 minutes each. Minimum of three cases for candidate per each panel)
C6-	Practical Planning	(1 hour)
C7-	Viva	1 hour (2 panels. 30 minutes each.)

4. Pass mark of each component is 50%

- (i) A mark 50% or more is obtained in each of the seven components of the examination.

or

- (ii) In the event that a score of 50% is not obtained for any one of the written components of the examination the candidate will be considered to have passed the examination **if all the following criteria are met.**

- a. An aggregate mark of 50% or more is obtained when the marks of all seven components is totaled
- b. has obtained an score of 50 % or more in each of the clinical components, long case, short cases, treatment planning and viva voce and,
- c. obtained a minimum mark of 45% in only one of the three written papers ,ie., Paper I,II and III . The candidate should have scored 50% or more in the other components.

5. Trainees could also be Board Certified with special training in **Paediatric Oncology** and **Haemato - Oncology** A trainee should have obtained prior board approval for such training after being successful at the MD(Clinical Oncology) Part II examination.

6. Past question papers are available for sale in the PGIM Library.

7. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD Part II examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examination will be counted as an attempt.

8. Please note that **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the Part II which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of first examination.** This requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the MD (Clinical Oncology) Part I examination before 1998. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.

9. The allocation of post MD training units will be done as described in “ General Regulations and Guidelines - 2017” which is available on the PGIM web site www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk .The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.

10. The candidates should commence the overseas training within five years after passing the MD Examination and if not the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

11. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

12. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

13. The candidates who shall commence the post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal. (PBCA)

14. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

15. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows :-

(a) Registration fee	- Rs. 5,000/= (non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs. 51,000/=
(c) Application fee	- Rs. 2000/= (non refundable)
(d) Case book Ass. Fee	- Rs. 2,500/=

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

16. The application form could be downloaded from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk on payment of 2000/-. **Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.**

17. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department confirming that the applicants if selected would be released for postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before **4th September 2017. Incomplete Applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

18. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website.

19. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

20. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the **Senate of the University**,

21. The candidates will be issued an **“Examination Feedback Form”** with the admission documents and this should be sent back to Director /PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination.** If the form is not returned it will be assumed that you do not have any concerns regarding the examination and it was conducted according to the Prospectus/rules/regulations of the PGIM. **No complaints or concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
