MD (PAEDIATRICS) EXAMINATION – JULY/AUGUST 2020

1. The Written Component of the above examination will commence on **Tuesday, 21 July 2020**. The examination will be held in Colombo.

*** The date given in the circular will subject to change due to the current covid 19 situation of the country. You will be given 2weeks time with the notification of actual date of the examination once the normalcy of the country is restored.**

2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the Examination.

(a) Satisfactory completion of all stages (I), (II) and (III) of the training programme as prescribed in the prospectus.

(b) Satisfactory Annual Reviews at each stage of training

(c) Overall attendance of 80% at every component in each stage of training

(d) Satisfactory Completion of **Professionalism and Ethics in Medical Practice Strand (Certificate issued by the PGIM should be submitted along with the application)**

Note :-

Those who are eligible in terms of the above requirements should submit the application and the “Log Book” which provides evidence of their successful completion of the said training. The signature of the relevant Consultant / Trainers should be obtained before submission of the Log Book.

3. The examination shall consist of written and clinical component.

(a) Written Component consists of following segments;
Segment I Structured Essay Question Paper
Segment II Case History Paper
Segment III Data Interpretation Paper
Segment IV Objective Structured Practical Examination (OSPE) – They are projected OSPEs

(b) Clinical Component consists of;

- One Long Case
- Structured Assessment of Clinical Skills (SACS)

4. Candidates are also informed that **Only those who obtain 50% or more in the entire written component and a minimum mark of 50% each for any two out of four segments and a minimum mark of 45% each for the remaining two segments will be allowed to proceed for the Clinical Component, which is scheduled to be held in Colombo.** All candidates will be informed in writing of their performance in the written component whether they are permitted or not, to proceed to the clinical component of the examination.

5. In the event of a candidate being successful only in the written component, the candidate should sit the entire examination including the written component in subsequent examination/s.
6. The clinical component of the examination will commence on **11 August 2020**.
7. To pass the clinical component of examination each candidate has to obtain a minimum mark of **50%** in each section i.e. Long Case & SACS. In the SACS component, a mark of 50% or above in **minimum of five stations** and overall mark of 50% or more are mandatory.
8. The subspecialties available and the number to be allocated to each shall be determined by the Ministry of Health and the qualified candidates will be informed before or at the allocation meeting.
9. Past question papers are available in the PGIM Library.
10. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.
11. Please note that **candidates are allowed 6 attempts only, in the MD which must be completed within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination**. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt. These requirement will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/Part I examinations before 1998.
12. The allocation of Post MD training units will be done as described in “General Regulation and Guidelines – 2020” which is available on the PGIM website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.
13. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the date of effective Board Certification.
14. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
15. There shall be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
16. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration is more than two years in sub specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
17. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
18. Following the component of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

19. The prescribed fees for the examination are as follows:-

- (a) Registration fee - Rs. 6,000/- (non refundable)
- (b) Examination fees - Rs.59,000/-
- (c) Application fee - Rs. 3,000/- (non refundable)

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

At the first instance candidates are required to pay Rs.6,000/-, for registration fee, Rs. 3,000 for application fee and Rs.29,500/- the entry fee for the written component. Those who qualify to proceed for the rest of the examination, i.e. Clinical component will have to pay the balance Examination fee of Rs.29,500/-.

21. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of the Department to reach the Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, No. 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before on or before **22 June 2020. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

(Please send the advance copy of your exam application along with the payment slip to exam@pgim.cmb.ac.lk on or before the deadline. You are permitted to send soft copies without the signatures of relevant authorities. However, you are required to send the duly completed application to be eligible to sit for the examination once the situation normalizes.)


22. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website – www.health.gov.lk/

23. Please bring the contents of the Circular to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

24. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

25. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and **NOT** regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
