**SELECTION EXAMINATION FOR ENROLMENT TO THE IN-SERVICE TRAINING
PROGRAMME IN MD PAEDIATRICS – SEPTEMBER 2020**

1. The above examination is scheduled to commence on **Wednesday, 23 September 2020**.
2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers in the state sector and non-state sector possessing the following requirements to sit the Selection Examination for enrolment to the in-service training programme in MD (Paediatrics) :-
 - (a) Hold a medical degree registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
 - (b) Satisfactory completion of internship acceptable to the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
 - (c) Satisfactory completion of one year of post internship in Medical/Clinical practice in a university/public/private sector institution in Sri Lanka acceptable to the PGIM as at the date of closure of applications, i.e. **21 August 2020**.
 - (d) Should have any one of the following
 - i. Completion of six months of continuous service experience in a General Paediatric Medical Unit as “first on call” medical officer, either during internship or afterwards, which should be within 07 years of the closing date of applications.

or
 - ii. Completion of six months of continuous service experience in a General Paediatric Surgical Unit as “first on call” medical officer either during internship or afterwards, **AND** three months of continuous service experience as first on-call medical officer in a Paediatric Medical Unit, which should be within 07 years of the closing date of application.

or
 - iii. Completion of six months of continuous service experience in a neonatology or any other paediatric sub speciality as “first on-call” medical officer **AND** three months of first on-call experience in a Paediatric Medical Unit which should be within 07 years of the closing date of application.
- **Provide documentary evidence for ii & iii certified by the relevant supervised consultant.**
- * Foreign nationals who seek registration in respect of selection test should possess a medical degree registrable with the Sri Lanka Medical Council.

Note: The criteria prescribed in paragraph (c) must have been satisfied by the applicants as at the date of closure of applications, provided that where a short-fall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examination.

3. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the Selection Examination. The current format of the selection examination is described in the prospectus 2013.
4. The examination consists of two components.
 - I) MCQ Paper
 - Part I (consists of 30 “True/False” questions)
 - Part II (consists of 30 Single Best Response **SBR type** questions)
 - II) Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE) 15 Stations, and total duration shall be one hour & 15 minutes
5. The MCQ papers will be held on **Wednesday, 23 September 2020**. Only those who obtain a minimum mark of 45% for **each** part and, overall mark of 50% or more for the MCQ component will be allowed to proceed for the OSCE which will be held on a subsequent date decided by the Board of Study in Paediatrics.
6. In order to pass the exam a candidate should obtain 45% or more for MCQ Paper I AND 45% or more for MCQ Paper II AND overall mark of 50% for the MCQ component AND 50% or more for OSCE with 50% or more for any 08 OSCE stations.
7. The permitted number of attempts of an eligible candidate at a particular MD Selection Examination is limited to six (06). However, candidates who have already exhausted four (04) or more attempts would be allowed only two (02) more attempts. Those who have sat less than four (04) attempts would be allowed up to a maximum total six (06) attempts. This regulation comes into effect from 27.05.2020.
8. **Only a maximum of 24 candidates** from the **Ministry of Health (MOH)** who pass the Selection Examination will be enrolled in the training programme. Placements will be made purely in the order of merit. The details are available at the Examination Branch office of the PGIM and on the PGIM website under “General Regulations and Guidelines 2020”. **The 24th MOH candidate’s marks will be taken as the cut-off line and the candidates in sections 10 , 11, 12 & 13 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.**
9. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.
10. All candidates attached to **Other Government Ministries** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut – off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
11. All candidates from **State Universities** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit
12. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including Police)** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
13. All **Non-State Sector** candidates who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme. They will be placed below the order of merit for candidates from the MOH, Other Government Ministries, State Universities and Armed Forces (including Police) based on the merit within the non-state sector category.
14. Following the examination and release of results the above numbers shall not be changed nor shall requests for such changes be entertained.

15. The allocation training units will be done as described in “General Regulation and Guidelines – 2020” and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.
16. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another eligible candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.
17. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrollment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health, Other Government Ministries, Universities or Armed Forces.
18. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows for state candidates.
 - (a) Application fee - Rs. 3,000/- (non refundable)
 - (b) Registration fee - Rs. 6,000/- (non refundable)
 - (b) Examination fees - Rs.37,000/-
(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

Candidates are required to pay Rs.6,000.00 as registration fee, Rs. 3,000.00 as application fee and Rs.23,000.00 as the entry fee for the MCQ Paper in the first instance. Those who qualify the MCQ Papers (Component 1) will have to pay the balance entry fee of Rs. 14,000.00 in order to proceed for the rest of the examination (Component 2).

19. The Application form could be download from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk
20. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of the Department confirming that the applicant if selected would be released for the Postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Senior Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, No. 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before **21st August 2020. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**
21. The relevant information of the training programme, MD Examination requirements for Board Certification are described in the Prospectus 2013 and other relevant documents which are published on the PGIM website.
22. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification.
23. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
24. the minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification should be one year local & one year overseas. However the duration may be more that two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
25. The candidate who shall commence the pre MD (Registrar) or Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
26. There should be no delay in submitting the research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

27. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
28. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
29. The candidates will be issued an **“Examination Feedback Form”** with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
30. A trainee following a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD programme shall not be permitted to sit another selection examination for a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD. If the trainee leaves the course before completion of a programme/course of study, he/she shall not be permitted to sit for another selection examination for a minimum period of two years from the date of leaving the programme/course of study. This rule shall not apply for online and part time courses.
31. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo the Professionalism & Ethics in Medical Practice Strand organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is compulsory for all MD trainees and should be completed within the first two years of pre-MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who complete this strand successfully.
32. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.
