<u>MD OBSTETRICS & GYNAECOLOGY EXAMINATION – (2017 PROSPECTUS) - SEPTEMBER 2020</u>

- 1. The above examination will commence on Thursday 17th September 2020. The examination will be held in Colombo.
- 2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination.
 - (a) Satisfactory completion of 27 months of training (Stage 1,2 and 3) in Obstetrics & Gynaecology in main training units.
 - (b) Satisfactory completion of one Obstetrics and Gynaecology appointment of 6 months duration in a unit in the peripheral circuit (Stage 3)
 - (c) Satisfactory completion of one Gynaecological Oncology appointment of 3 months duration in an approved unit (Stage 3)
 - (d) Obtain a "Pass grade" for both ISTA 1 and 2.
 - (e) Satisfactory progress reports acceptable to the BOS.
 - (f) Satisfactory Peer Team Ratings acceptable to the BOS.
 - (g) A duly completed training Portfolio which is accepted ("Pass" grade) by the assessors.
 - (h) Satisfactory progress reports of the Research project.
 - (i) Satisfactory professional conduct and attaendance during the training period certified by the trainers.
 - (j) Good health certified by a specialist approved by the PGIM
 - (k) Candidates are required to submit **Professionalism and Ethics in Medical Practice Strand Certificate** issued by the PGIM.

Note: It is a requirement by the Board of Study for the candidates to present the Portfolio maintained by them during the training period as a Registrar **for the examination** with the necessary certifications by the Supervisory Consultants.

3. The examination will consist of 3 components:

(1) Theory Papers

Written Paper - 06 questions 03 hours

SEQ (04 questions)

SAQ (02 questions)

MCQ - 60 questions 02 hours

30 SBA 30 EMI

(2) OSCE - 09 stations 135 minutes

(3) Clinical - Obs. Case 60 minutes

Gyn. Case 60 minutes

Requirements to pass the examination: -

The candidate must obtain a total mark of 1200 (60%) or more out of 2000.

AND

50% (500 marks) or more out of 1000 marks for Theory (Written & MCQ)

AND

60% (240 marks) out of 400 or more for OSCE

AND

60% (360 marks) out of 600 or more for Clinical

- 4. The application form can be downloaded from the website http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk.
- 5. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.
- 6. Please note that the candidates are allowed only 6 attempts of the MD examination which must be completed within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination. However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt. These requirements will not apply to those candidates who have sat the Selection/ Part I examinations before 1998.
- 7. The allocation of training units will be done as described in "General Regulation & Guidelines 2020" which is available on PGIM website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.

- 8. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the date of effective Board Certification. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
- 9. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly
- 10. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
- 11. The candidates who shall commence the pre MD (Registrar) or Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 01st August 2011 should pass the Pre- Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
- 12. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
- 13. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows:-

(a) Registration fee Rs. 6,000/= (Non Refundable)

(b) Examination fee Rs. 59,000/=

(c) Application fee Rs. 3,000/= (Non Refundable)

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted

- 14. The application form can be downloaded from the website http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk
- 15. Complete applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department, confirming that the applicants if selected would be released for postgraduate training in the PGIM. The applications should reach the Asst. Registrar/ Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Norris Canal Road, Colombo 07 on or before **08**th **September 2020**. The envelope should be marked "Application for MD (Obstetrics & Gynaecology)" at the top left hand corner. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.
- 16. There shall be no repeat or additional examinations which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar.
- 17. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website www.health.gov.lk
- 18. The results will be valid and official only after they are approved by the Senate of the University.

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- 19. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (e.g. perceived biases, discriminatory behavior, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
