MD PART I EXAMINATION IN CHEMICAL PATHOLOGY – DECEMBER 2020

- 1. The above examination will commence on 28 December 2020.
- * The date given in the circular will subject to change due to the current covid 19 situations of the country. You will be given 2 weeks time with the notification of actual date with the examination once the normality of the country is restored.
- 2. Applications are invited from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the examination.
 - (a) Completion of two years of training leading to the MD in Chemical Pathology examination with a minimum of 80% attendance for the Course in Baisc Laboratory Sciences and minimum of 80% attendance for the laboratory based training in Chemical Pathology of twenty one month's duration.
 - (b) Sitting the theory and practical assessment in the Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences.
 - (c) Satisfactory progress reports.
 - (d) Submission of the Portfolio one month before the examination.
- 3. The examination shall consist of three components i.e. Theory & Practical & CBLS Assessment

Component 1 – Theory Paper I – MCQ Paper – 2 hours (20 MTF,15 SBR, 15 EMQ)
Theory Paper II (Short Answer Question) – 3 hours (20 compulsory SAQ's

Component 2 - Practical Paper I

(Consist of three questions on clinical data interpretation and two question on calculations related to Chemical Pathology. (1 hours)

Practical Paper II

(This Paper consists of bench practical work and will have two sessions of approximately 3 hours each) (6 hours)

Component 3 – CBLS Assessment

- 4. Candidates should obtain a minimum of 50% for the theory (Component 1) (20/40) and a minimum of 50% for the practical (component 2) (25/50) and 50% overall marks to pass the MD in Chemical Pathology Part I examination.
- 5. Please note that candidates are allowed 6 attempts only in the Part I examination which must be completed within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination. However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.

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- 6. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD Part I examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.
- 7. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows:

a) Application fee - Rs. 3,000.00 (non refundable) b) Registration fee - Rs. 6,000.00 (non refundable)

c) Examination fees - Rs.37,000.00

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

- 8. The Application form could be download from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk
- 9. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded to the Senior Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, No. 160, Prof. Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 7 on or before **20 November 2020. Incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**
- 10. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the date of effective Board Certification.
- 11. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
- 12. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
- 13. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
- 14. The candidates who shall commence the Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 01st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.
- 15. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
- 16. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health website www.health.gov.lk/
- 17. There shall be <u>no repeat or additional examinations</u> which are not scheduled in the approved examination calendar year 2020.
- 18. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

- 19. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
- 20. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD pragramme should undergo the Professionalism & Ethics in Medical Practice Strand organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is compulsory for all MD trainees and should be completed within the first two years of pre-MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who complete this strand successfully.
- 21. A trainee following a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD programme shall not be permitted to sit another selection examination for a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD. If the trainee leaves the course before completion of a programme/course of study, he/she shall not be permitted to sit for another selection examination for a minimum period of two years from the date of leaving the programme/course of study. This rule shall not apply for online and part time courses.
- 22. Candidates are requested to visit the PGIM website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk for further updates.
