Section I

Instructions to Bidders

ITB shall be read in conjunction with the Section II, Bidding Data Sheet (BDS), which shall take precedence over ITB.

General

1. Scope of Bid	1.1 The Purchaser indicated in the Bidding Data Sheet (BDS), issues these Bidding Documents for the supply of Goods and Related Services incidental thereto as specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements. The name and identification number of this procurement are specified in the BDS. The name, identification, and number of lots (individual contracts), if any, are provided in the BDS. 1.2 Throughout these Bidding Documents: (a) the term "in writing" means communicated in written form by mail (other than electronic mail) or hand delivered with proof of receipt;
	(b) if the context so requires, "singular" means "plural" and vice versa; and (c) "day" means calendar day.
2. Source of	2.1 Payments under this contract will be financed by the source specified in
Funds	the BDS.
3. Ethics, Fraud and Corruption	3.1 The attention of the bidders is drawn to the following guidelines of the Procurement Guidelines published by National Procurement Agency:
6	Parties associated with Procurement Act ions, namely, suppliers/contractors and officials shall ensure that they maintain strict confidentiality throughout the process;
	Officials shall refrain from receiving any personal gain from any Procurement Act ion. No gifts or inducement shall be accepted. Suppliers/contractors are liable to be disqualified from the bidding process if found offering any gift or inducement which may have an effect of influencing a decision or impairing the objectivity of an official.
	3.2 The Purchaser requires the bidders, suppliers, contractors, and consultants to observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts. In pursuit of this policy:
	(a) "corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting,

	directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution;
	(b) "fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract;(c) "collusive practice" means a scheme or arrangement between two or more bidders, with or without the knowledge of the Purchaser to establish bid prices at artificial, noncompetitive levels; and
	(d) "coercive practice" means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the procurement process or affect the execution of a contract.
	3.3 If the Purchaser found any unethical practices as stipulated under ITB Clause 3.2, the Purchaser will reject a bid, if it is found that a Bidder directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question.
4. Eligible	4.1 All bidders shall possess legal rights to supply the Goods under this

	4.2 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. All bidders found to have
	conflict of interest shall be disqualified. Bidders may be considered to have a conflict of interest with one or more parties in this bidding process, if they:
	(a) are or have been associated in the past, with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Purchaser to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under these Bidding Documents; or
	(b) submit more than one bid in this bidding process. However, this does not limit the participation of subcontractors in more than one bid.
So	4.3 A Bidder that is under a declaration of ineligibility by the National Procurement Commission (NPC), at the date of submission of bids or at the date of contract award, shall be disqualified. The list of debarred firms is available at the website of NPC.
	4.4 Foreign Bidder may submit a bid only if so stated in the in the BDS.

Clarification of 7.1 A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Bidding Documents including the restrictiveness of specifications shall contact the **Documents** Purchaser in writing at the Purchaser's address specified in the BDS. 	14.2 Any discount offered against any single item in the price schedule shall be included in the unit price of the item. However, a Bidder wishes to offer discount as a lot the bidder may do so by indicating such amounts appropriately.
	14.3 If so indicated in ITB Sub-Clause 1.1, bids are being invited for individual contracts (lots) or for any combination of contracts (packages). Unless otherwise indicated in the BDS, prices quoted shall correspond to

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	100 % of the items specified for each lot and to 100% of the quantities specified for each item of a lot. Bidders wishing to offer any price reduction (discount) for the award of more than one Contract shall specify the applicable price reduction separately.
	14.4 (i) Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall include all duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable by the Supplier:
	(a) on components and raw material used in the manufacture or assembly of goods quoted; or
	(b) on the previously imported goods of foreign origin.
	(ii) However, VAT shall not be included in the price but shall be indicated separately;
	(iii) the price for inland transportation, insurance and other related services to deliver the goods to their final destination;
	(iv) the price of other incidental services
	14.5 The Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the Contract and not subject to variation on any account. A bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and rejected, pursuant to ITB Clause 31.
	14.6 All lots, if any, and items must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules. If a Price Schedule shows items listed but not priced, their prices shall be assumed to be included in the prices of other items.
15. Currencies of Bid	15.1 Unless otherwise stated in Bidding Data Sheet, the Bidder shall quote in Sri Lankan Rupees and payment shall be payable only in Sri Lanka Rupees.
16. Documents Establishing the Eligibility of the Bidder	16.1 To establish their eligibility in accordance with ITB Clause 4, Bidders shall complete the Bid Submission Form, included in Section IV, Bidding Forms.
17. Documents Establishing the Conformity of the Goods and Related Services	17.1 To establish the conformity of the Goods and Related Services to the Bidding Documents, the Bidder shall furnish as part of its Bid the documentary evidence that the Goods conform to the technical specifications and standards specified in Section V, Schedule of Requirements.
	17.2 The documentary evidence may be in the form of literature, drawings or data, and shall consist of a detailed item by item description (given in Section V, Technical Specifications) of the essential technical and performance characteristics of the Goods and Related Services, demonstrating substantial responsiveness of the Goods and Related Services to the technical specification, and if applicable, a statement of

	deviations and exceptions to the provisions of the Schedule of Requirements.
	17.3 The Bidder shall also furnish a list giving full particulars, including quantities, available sources and current prices of spare parts, special tools, etc., necessary for the proper and continuing functioning of the Goods during the period if specified in the BDS following commencement of the use of the goods by the Purchaser.
18. Documents Establishing the	18.1 The documentary evidence of the Bidder's qualifications to perform the contract if its bid is accepted shall establish to the Purchaser's satisfaction:
Qualifications of the Bidder	(a) A Bidder that does not manufacture or produce the Goods it offers to supply shall submit the Manufacturer's Authorization using the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms to demonstrate that it has been duly authorized by the manufacturer or producer of the Goods to supply these
	Goods; (b) that, if required in the BDS, in case of a Bidder not doing business within
	Sri Lanka, the Bidder is or will be (if awarded the contract) represented by an Agent in Sri Lanka equipped and able to carry out the Supplier's maintenance, repair and spare parts stocking obligations prescribed in the Conditions of Contract and/or Technical Specifications; and
	(c) That the Bidder meets each of the qualification criterion specified in Section III, Evaluation and Qualification Criteria.
19. Period of Validity of Bids	19.1 Bids shall remain valid until the date specified in the BDS. A bid valid for a shorter date shall be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive.
	19.2 In exceptional circumstances, prior to the expiration of the bid validity date, the Purchaser may request bidders to extend the period of validity of their bids. The request and the responses shall be made in writing. If a Bid Security is requested in accordance with ITB Clause 20, it shall also be extended for a corresponding period. A Bidder may refuse the request without forfeiting its Bid Security. A Bidder granting the request shall not be required or permitted to modify its bid.
20. Bid Security	20.1 The Bidder shall furnish as part of its bid, a Bid Security or a Bid-Securing Declaration, as specified in the BDS.
	20.2 The Bid Security shall be in the amount specified in the BDS and denominated in Sri Lanka Rupees, and shall:
	(a) at the bidder's option, be in the form of either a bank draft, a letter of credit, or a bank guarantee from a banking institution;
	(b) be issued by an institution acceptable to Purchaser. The acceptable institutes are published in the NPC website.
	(c) be substantially in accordance with the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms;

	(d) be payable promptly upon written demand by the Purchaser in case the conditions listed in ITB Clause 20.5 are invoked;
	(e) be submitted in its original form; copies will not be accepted;
	(f) remain valid for the period specified in the BDS.
	20.3 Any bid not accompanied by a substantially responsive Bid Security or Bid Securing Declaration in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 20.1 and 20.2, may be rejected by the Purchaser as non-responsive. 20.4 The Bid Security of unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned as promptly as possible upon the successful Bidder's furnishing of the Performance Security pursuant to ITB Clause 43.
	20.5 The Bid Security may be forfeited, or the Bid Securing Declaration executed:
	(a) if a Bidder withdraws its bid during the period of bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Submission Form, except as provided in ITB Sub-Clause 19.2; or
	(b) if a Bidder does not agree to correction of arithmetical errors in pursuant to ITB Sub-Clause 30.3
	(c) if the successful Bidder fails to:
	(i) sign the Contract in accordance with ITB Clause 42;
	(ii) furnish a Performance Security in accordance with ITB Clause 43.

22. Submission, Sealing and	22.1 Bidders may always submit their bids by mail or by hand.
Marking of Bids	(a) Bidders submitting bids by mail or by hand, shall enclose the original and

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	the copy of the Bid in separate sealed envelopes, duly marking the envelopes as "ORIGINAL" and "COPY." These envelopes containing the original and the copy shall then be enclosed in one single envelope.
	22.2 The inner and outer envelopes shall:
	(a) Bear the name and address of the Bidder;
	(b) be addressed to the Purchaser in accordance with ITB Sub-Clause 23.1;
	(c) bear the specific identification of this bidding process as indicated in the BDS; and

26. Bid Opening

26.1 The Purchaser shall conduct the bid opening in public at the address, date and time specified in the BDS.

26.2 First, envelopes marked "WITHDRAWAL" shall be opened and read out and the envelope with the corresponding bid may be opened at the discretion of the Purchaser. No bid withdrawal shall be permitted unless the corresponding withdrawal notice contains a valid authorization to request the withdrawal and is read out at bid opening. Envelopes marked "MODIFICATION" shall be opened and read out with the corresponding Bid. No Bid modification shall be permitted unless the corresponding modification notice contains a valid authorization to request the modification and is read out at Bid opening. Only envelopes that are opened and read out at Bid opening shall be considered further.

26.3 All other envelopes shall be opened one at a time, reading out: the name of the Bidder and whether there is a modification; the Bid Prices, including any discounts and alternative offers; the presence of a Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration, if required; and any other details as the Purchaser may consider appropriate. Only discounts and alternative offers read out at Bid opening shall be considered for evaluation. No Bid shall be rejected at Bid opening except for late bids, in accordance with ITB Sub Section I Clause 24.1.

26.4 The Purchaser shall prepare a record of the Bid opening that shall include, as a minimum: the name of the Bidder and whether there is a withdrawal, or modification; the Bid Price, per lot if applicable, including any discounts, and the presence or absence of a Bid Security or Bid-Securing Declaration. The bids that were opened shall be resealed in separate envelopes, promptly after the bid opening. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall be requested to sign the attendance sheet. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Bidders who submitted bids in time.

Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

27. Confidentiality

27.1 Information relating to the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification (if applicable) of bids, and recommendation of contract award, shall not be disclosed to bidders or any other persons not officially concerned with such process until publication of the Contract Award.

27.2 Any effort by a Bidder to influence the Purchaser in the examination, evaluation, comparison, and post-qualification of the bids or contract award decisions may result in the rejection of its Bid.

27.3 Notwithstanding ITB Sub-Clause 27.2, if any Bidder wishes to contact

the Purchaser on any matter related to the bidding process, from the time
of bid opening to the time of Contract Award, it should do so in writing.
28.1 To assist in the examination, evaluation, comparison and post-
qualification of the bids, the Purchaser may, at its discretion, request any
Bidder for a clarification of its Bid. Any clarification submitted by a Bidder in
respect to its Bid and that is not in response to a request by the Purchaser
shall not be considered for purpose of evaluation. The Purchaser's request
for clarification and the response shall be in writing. No change in the prices
or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered, or permitted, except to
confirm the correction of arithmetic errors discovered by the Purchaser in
the Evaluation of the bids, in accordance with ITB Clause 30.
29.1 The Purchaser's determination of a bid's responsiveness is to be based
on the contents of the bid itself.
29.2 A substantially responsive Bid is one that conforms to all the terms,
conditions, and specifications of the Bidding Documents without material
deviation, reservation, or omission. A material deviation, reservation, or
omission is one that:
(a) affects in any substantial way the scope, quality, or performance of the
Goods and Related Services specified in the Contract; or
(IA) Partie to a combined and a second second to the Bridge of Barrier and
(b) limits in any substantial way, inconsistent with the Bidding Documents,
the Purchaser's rights or the Bidder's obligations under the Contract; or
(c) if rectified would unfairly affect the competitive position of other bidders
presenting substantially responsive bids.
29.3 If a bid is not substantially responsive to the Bidding Documents, it shall
be rejected by the Purchaser and may not subsequently be made responsive
by the Bidder by correction of the material deviation, reservation, or
omission.
30.1 Provided that a Bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may
waive any non-conformities or omissions in the Bid that do not constitute a
material deviation.
30.2 Provided that a bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser may
request that the Bidder submit the necessary information or
documentation, within a reasonable period of time, to rectify nonmaterial
nonconformities or omissions in the bid related to documentation
requirements. Such omission shall not be related to any aspect of the price of the Bid. Failure of the Bidder to comply with the request may result in the
rejection of its Bid.

30.3 Provided that the Bid is substantially responsive, the Purchaser shall
correct arithmetical errors on the following basis:
(a) if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the line item total
that is obtained by multiplying the unit price by the quantity, the unit price
shall prevail and the line item total shall be corrected, unless in the opinion

- (h) "Purchaser" means the entity purchasing the Goods and Related Services, as specified in the Contract Data.
- (i) "Related Services" means the services incidental to the supply of the goods, such as insurance, installation, training and initial maintenance and other such obligations of the Supplier under the Contract.

27.5 Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, within the period specified in the Contract Data, expeditiously repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof, at no cost to the Purchaser.
