**SELECTION EXAMINATION FOR MD IN OBSTETRICS & GYNAECOLOGY –
FEBRUARY/ APRIL 2021**

- 1 The above examination is scheduled to commence on **23rd February 2021**.

- 2 Applications are invited by me from medical officers in the state sector and non-state sector possessing the following requirements to sit the Selection Examination for enrolment to the above training programme.
 - (a) Hold a medical degree registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council.
 - (b) Complete an internship recognized by the SLMC.
 - (c) Complete one-year work experience in Sri Lanka, after internship.
 - (d) Produce a medical certificate from a Board-Certified specialist physician to confirm the general mental and physical fitness.
 - (e) **Produce a certificate to confirm the participation in a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation(CPR) programme conducted by a professional organization.**
 - (f) Complying with any other PGIM regulations.

Note: The criteria prescribed in paragraph (c) must have been satisfied by the applicants as at the date of closure of applications, provided that where a short-fall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examination.

3. The applicants to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme should pass the Selection Examination. The current format of the selection examination is described in the prospectus 2017.
4. The Selection Examination consists of a MCQ Paper and Written Paper.
 - MCQ Paper with 50 questions (20 True/ False type and 30 Single Best Answers) of 02 ½ hours duration.
 - Written Paper shall consist of four (04) Structured Essay Questions (SEQ) and two (02) Short Answer Questions (SAQ) of 03 hours duration.

Candidates who obtain a mark of 50% or more for the MCQ Paper will be allowed to proceed the other component (Written Paper) of the examination which is scheduled to be held on 20th April 2021.

5. The candidate should obtain an aggregate of 50% or more of the total (300 or more out of 600) and
50% or more for the MCQ paper (150 out of 300) and
50% or more for the Written paper (150 out of 300) to be admitted to the training programme
6. **Up to a maximum of 30 candidates** from the **Ministry of Health (MOH)** who pass the Selection Examination will be enrolled in the training programme. **The 30th MOH candidate's marks will be taken as the cut-off line and the candidates in sections 8, 9 , 10 & 11 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.**
7. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.
8. All candidates attached to **Other Government Ministries** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut – off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
9. All candidates from **State Universities** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit
10. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including Police)** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
11. All **Non-State Sector** candidates who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme. They will be placed below the order of merit

for candidates from the MOH, Other Government Ministries, State Universities and Armed Forces (including Police) based on the merit within the non-state sector category.

12. The permitted number of attempts of an eligible candidate at a particular MD Selection Examination is limited to six (06). However, candidates who have already exhausted four (04) or more attempts would be allowed only two (02) more attempts. Those who have sat less than four (04) attempts would be allowed up to a maximum total six (06) attempts. This regulation comes into effect from 27.05.2020.
13. Following the examination and release of results the above numbers shall not be changed nor shall requests for such changes be entertained.
14. The allocation of training units will be done as described in “General Regulation and Guidelines – 2020” and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.
15. At the point of post MD allocation, the base specialty and any available subspecialties which are approved at the time of the post MD allocation will be offered to candidates, according to merit. The number of available base specialty and subspecialty training vacancies offered for Post MD training if any will be determined based on the vacancy list provided by the MOH prior to the post MD allocation.
16. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another eligible candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.
17. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrollment if such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health, Other Government Ministries, Universities or Armed Forces.
18. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows for state candidates.
 - (a) Application fee - Rs. 3,000.00 (non refundable)
 - (b) Registration fee - Rs. 6,000.00 (non refundable)
 - (c) Examination fees - Rs.37,000.00

Candidates are required to pay Rs. 6,000/- for the registration, Rs. 3,000/- for Application and rs. 23,000/- the examination fee for the MCQ paper, at the first instance. Those who qualify the MCQ Examination will have to pay the balance examination fee of Rs. 14,000/- in order to proceed for the rest of the examination.

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

18. The Application form could be download from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk

19. Duly filled application should be forwarded through the Head of the Department confirming that the applicant if selected would be released for the Postgraduate training in the PGIM. All the candidates **should send the scan copy of your application** after obtaining all the signatures of relevant authorities to exam@pgim.cmb.ac.lk and applicants are recommended to send the hard copy of the application to the Assistant Registrar/Examinations, Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, 160, Professor Nandadasa Kodagoda Mawatha, Colombo 07 on or before **25th January 2021. If you are unable to send the hard copy of the application, please mention the fact in the same email. Incomplete, handwritten and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances**

20. The relevant information of the training programme, MD Examination requirements for Board Certification is described in the Prospectus 2017. However if amendments have been made following printing of the Prospectus, the circulars with such amendments may be collected from the examination branch office of the PGIM. These circulars will also be handed over to the selected candidates at the commencement of the training programme.

21. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.

22. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification should be one year local & one year overseas. However the duration may be more that two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

23. The candidate who shall commence the pre MD (Registrar) or Post MD (Senior Registrar) training after 1st August 2011 should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

24. There should be no delay in submitting the research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

25. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

26. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.

27. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers concerned in your department/division/faculty.

28. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of Medical Officers of Department of Health in MOH website – www.health.gov.lk/

29. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

30. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.

31. A trainee following a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD programme shall not be permitted to sit another selection examination for a PG Certificate or PG Diploma or MSc or MD. If the trainee leaves the course before completion of a programme/course of study, he/she shall not be permitted to sit for another selection examination for a minimum period of two years from the date of leaving the programme/course of study. This rule shall not apply for online and part time courses.

32. The candidate who pass the Selection Examination and are selected for the MD programme should undergo the Professionalism & Ethics in Medical Practice Strand organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is compulsory for all MD trainees and should be completed within the first two years of pre-MD training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who complete this strand successfully.
