
MSc IN BIOMEDICAL INFORMATICS (SEMESTER III) BATCH 10 EXAMINATION-
MAY 2021

1. The above Examination is scheduled to commence on **21st May 2021**
2. Applications are invited by me up to **12th May 2021** from medical officers/ non –medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination
 - Demonstrate at least 80% attendance for lecture sessions and laboratory work during the semester for which the assessment is held.
3. The Examination shall consist of following components.
 - a) Assignments - For M12 & M15
 - b) Theory Paper- For M11, M13 & M14
4. A candidate should obtain a minimum of Grade C (equivalent to a grade point of 2.0) for each module Assignment / Theory Paper to pass a module.
5. The prescribed fees for the examination for candidates in the state sector as follows:-

(a) Application fee	- Rs.	3,500/= (Non Refundable)
(b) Registration fee	- Rs.	8,000/= (Non Refundable)
(c) Examination fees	- Rs.	20,000/= (Non Refundable)

(Only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM)
(Candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)
6. The application form can be downloaded from the website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk>.
7. Applications with **every cage duly filled** should be forwarded through the Head of Department. The applications should reach the Senior Assistant Registrar/ Examinations, PGIM. No. 160, Professor Nandadasa Kodagoda Mw, Colombo 7 **on or before 12th May 2021**. The envelope should be marked “Application for MSc Biomedical Informatics Semester III Examination” at the top left hand corner **incomplete applications and late applications will not be considered under any circumstances.**

8. Please bring the contents of the Circular Letter to the notice of all medical officers/ dental surgeons concerned in your department/division/faculty.

10. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
