Selection Examination for Postgraduate Diploma in Transfusion Medicine – October 2021

1. The above examination is scheduled to commence on **11 October 2021**.

*** The date given in the circular will subject to change due to the current covid 19 situation of the country. You will be given 2weeks time with the notification of actual date of the examination once the normality of the country is restored.**

2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers in the state and non-state sectors possessing the following requirements to sit the Selection Examination for Postgraduate Diploma in Transfusion Medicine.

- (a) A medical degree registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
- (b) Satisfactory completion of internship acceptable the Sri Lanka Medical Council;
- (c) Satisfactory completion of one year of post internship in medical/ Clinical practice or teaching in a University/ Public / Private Sector Institution/ Non-state Sector in Sri Lanka acceptable to the PGIM as at the date of closure of applications, ie. **14th September 2021**.

Notes:- The criteria prescribed in paragraph (c) must have been satisfied by the applicants as at the date of closure of applications, provided that where a short-fall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examination.

3. The applicants to be eligible for enrollment to the training programme should pass the selection examination. The current format of the selection examination for the perusal of applicants is described in the prospectus and examination documents which are available on the PGIM web site.

4. The selection examination shall consist a Written Paper of Structured Essay Questions of three hours duration. The content areas from which the questions are based on is described in the prospectus and relevant documents available at the PGIM.
Number of questions – 6 out of 8 questions should be answered.

5. Candidates who pass the selection examination by obtaining 50% or more of the total aggregate only shall be considered for enrolment to the course.

6. Past question papers are available in the PGIM Library. <https://library.pgim.cmb.ac.lk/>

7. The permitted number of attempts of an eligible candidate at a particular PGD selection Examination is unlimited. However, in order to proceed for the MD after being successful at the Postgraduate Diploma examination, the candidate should have passed the Selection Examination for Postgraduate Diploma within 6 attempts. This regulation comes into effect from 30.09.2020
8. **Only a maximum of 08 candidates from the Ministry of Health (MOH) who pass the Selection Examination will be enrolled in the training programme. Placements will be made purely in the order of merit. The details are available at the Examination Branch office of the PGIM and on the PGIM website under “General Regulations and Guidelines 2021”. The 08th MOH candidate’s marks will be taken as a cut-off line and the candidates in sections 10, 11, 12 & 13 will have to obtain a mark similar to this or above to be offered a place in the training programme.**
9. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.
10. All candidates attached to **Other Government Ministries** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut – off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
11. All candidates from **State Universities** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit
12. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including Police)** who pass the selection examination and who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.
13. All **Non-State Sector** candidates who are above the cut- off line will be enrolled in the training programme. They will be placed below the order of merit for candidates from the MOH, State Universities, other Government Ministries and Armed Forces (including Police) based on the merit within the non-state sector category.
14. Following the examination and release of results the above numbers shall not be changed nor shall requests for such changes be entertained.
15. Each year only the scheduled Selection Examination in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examination will be held.
16. The allocation of training units will be done as described in **“General Regulations and Guidelines – 2021** and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.
17. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If this is not done another eligible candidate will be selected. And the candidate, who refused, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.
18. For all fulltime training programmes fulltime release from Ministry of Health is a prerequisite for enrollment. When relevant it may be necessary to sign a bond before such enrollment of such a requirement has been decided by the Ministry of Health, other Government Ministries, University or Armed Forces.
19. The relevant information of the training programme, MD Examination, requirements for Board Certification are described in the Prospectus and other relevant documents which are published on the PGIM Website.

20. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification.
21. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
22. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available on the PGIM web site for perusal.
23. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
24. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
25. The prescribed fees for the examination for candidates in the state sector are as follows:
 - (a) Registration fee - Rs. 8,000/- (non refundable)
 - (b) Examination fees - Rs.20,000/-
 - (c) Application fee - Rs. 3,500/- (non refundable)

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

26. The application form can be download from our website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk
27. All examination Applications and other documents are collected through a Google Form. <https://forms.gle/RfS5t3FGjVvB139Q7> on or before 14 September 2021. All applicants should have a Gmail Account to log in to a google form. PGIM trainees have to use the email account created by the PGIM. You should attach your exam application with all the relevant documents as a **single PDF** document since this portal does not allow you to attach multiple documents. **Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submission and application sent via email will not be accepted.**
28. The selected candidates should report to the training unit allocated to him/ her within one month on receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.
29. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
30. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and **NOT** regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
