MD PART I EXAMINATION IN CHEMICAL PATHOLOGY – FEBRUARY 2022

1. The above examination will commence on **21 February 2022**.
2. Applications are invited from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the examination.
 - (a) Completion of two years of training leading to the MD in Chemical Pathology examination with a minimum of 80% attendance for the Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences and minimum of 80% attendance for the laboratory based training in Chemical Pathology of twenty one month's duration.
 - (b) Sitting the theory and practical assessment in the Course in Basic Laboratory Sciences.
 - (c) Satisfactory progress reports.
 - (d) Submission of the Portfolio **one month before** the examination.
3. The examination shall consist of three components i.e. Theory & Practical & CBLA Assessment
 - Component 1 –Theory Paper I – MCQ Paper– 2 hours (20 MTF,15 SBR, 15 EMQ)
Theory Paper II (Short Answer Question) – 3 hours (20 compulsory SAQ's)
 - Component 2 - Practical Paper I
(Consist of three questions on clinical data interpretation and two question on calculations related to Chemical Pathology. (1 hours)
Practical Paper II
(This Paper consists of bench practical work and will have two sessions of approximately 3 hours each) (6 hours)
 - Component 3 – CBLA Assessment
4. Candidates should obtain a minimum of 50% for the theory (Component 1) (20/40) and a minimum of 50% for the practical (component 2) (25/50) and 50% overall marks to pass the MD in Chemical Pathology Part I examination.
5. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD Part I examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.

6. Please note that **candidates are allowed 6 attempts only in the Part I examination which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination.** However after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.

7. Each year only the MD Part I Examination in the approved examination calendar will be held. **no repeat or additional examinations will be held.**

8. The allocation of training units will be done as described in “General Regulation and Guidelines 2022” which is available on the PGIM web site: www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk. The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons. The number of available subspecialty training vacancies offered for post MD training, if any, will be determined based on the vacancy list provided by the MOH prior to the allocation.

9. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

10. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification. The trainee status of trainees will be terminated in those who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training

11. There should be no delay in submitting the research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification.

12. The trainees must, within one (1) calendar month of satisfactory completion of the prescribed requirements, apply for Board Certification. All relevant documents must be submitted with the application. Failure to do so will result in a delay of effective date of Board Certification.

13. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available on the PGIM website.

14. The prescribed fees for the examination shall be as follows:

- a) Application fee - Rs. 4,000.00 (non refundable)
- b) Registration fee - Rs. 8,000.00 (non refundable)
- c) Examination fees - Rs.46,500.00

candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above specified fees

Only payments made through the PGIM online portal will be accepted.

The Candidates have a use the email account created by the PGIM. The exam application with all relevant documents must be attached as a single PDF document since this portal does not allow uploading of multiple documents. **Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submission and application sent via email will not be accepted.**
