MD (MEDICAL MICROBIOLOGY) EXAMINATION – NOVEMBER 2022

1. The above examination will commence on **16th November 2022**.

2. Applications are invited by me from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the MD (Medical Microbiology) examination. Candidates must,

- (a) Show at least 80% attendance in each of the following training components -
 - (i) Hospital Microbiology Laboratory appointments
 - (ii) Infection Control training workshop
 - (iii) Antibiotic training workshop
 - (iv) Each special appointment
 - (v) Completion of Research project and submission of the dissertation before a stipulated date
 - (vi) Tutorials in Clinical Parasitology and Medical Microbiology
- (b) Obtain a satisfactory progress report from each hospital laboratory trainer
- (c) Submit 3 sets of Peer Team Rating forms.
- (d) Submit a duly completed portfolio.
- (e) Submit the dissertation.
- (f) Submit the certificate of the Professionalism & Ethics in Medical Practice Strand conducted by the PGIM.

3. The examination shall consist of three parts with six components, as set out below:

Part 1 - Theory with two components - Written Paper I and Paper II Part 2 - Practical with two components - Laboratory examination 1 and 2 Part 3 - Oral with two components - Portfolio and Dissertation.

- 4. To pass the MD in Microbiology Examination, a candidate is required to obtain the following:
 - (a) A total average of a minimum of 60% or more for the entire examination;AND
 - (b) A minimum of 50% or more for the Practical part of the examination (Laboratory examinations 1 and 2);

AND

(c) Obtain a minimum of 50% or more for the theory part of the examination (Written Papers I and II)

5. Candidates shall refer to the relevant prospectus for details of the examination.

6. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequent scheduled examination for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study the examinations will be counted as an attempts.

7. Please note that **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the MD examination which must be completed within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination**. However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted the sixth attempt.

8. The allocation of post MD training units will be done as described in "General Regulations & Guidelines -2022" and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.

9. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.

10. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

11. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

12. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM for perusal.

13. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant documents within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.

14. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows :-

(a) Application fee- Rs. 6,000.00 (Non refundable)(b) Registration fee- Rs. 12,000.00 (Non refundable)(c) Examination fees- Rs. 111,000.00(d) Dissertation assessment fee- Rs. 12,000.00

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM

(Candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

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15. The application form also could be downloaded from our website <u>www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk</u>.

16. All examination applications and other documents are collected through a Google Form, <u>https://forms.gle/sRujhbX9mYwcCvem7</u> on or before **14th October 2022.** Candidates have to use the email accounts created by the PGIM to access the Google form. The exam application with all relevant documents must be attached as a **single PDF** document since this portal does not allow uploading of multiple documents. **Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submissions and applications sent via email will not be accepted.**

17. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of medical officers of Department of Health in MOH web site - <u>www.health.gov.lk/</u>.

18. Each year only the scheduled selection examination in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examinations will be held.

19. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.

20. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and <u>NOT</u> regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
