SELECTION EXAMINATION FOR THE TRAINING PROGRAMME OF MD IN ORAL & MAXILLOFACIAL SURGERY/ RESTORATIVE DENTISTRY/ ORTHODONTICS – 2022 (RESCHEDULED- 2023)

1. The above examination will commence on 17th January, 2023.
2. Applications are invited by me from dental officers in the state and the non-state sectors possessing the following requirements to sit the Selection Examination for enrolment to the MD in Oral & Maxillofacial surgery, MD in Restorative Dentistry and MD in Orthodontics training programmes in Dental Surgery.
 - a.) Hold a dental degree and Registered with the Sri Lanka Medical Council
AND
 - b.) Satisfactory completion of at least one year of service in dental practice in the government, university, armed forces or private sector, **following registration with the SLMC** at the time of closure of applications for the selection. (A copy of the certificate should be attached with the application.)

Note: The criteria prescribed in paragraph (b) must have been satisfied by the applicants as at the date of closure of applications i.e. 10th January, 2023 provided that where a shortfall has occurred due to any reasons including sick, maternity or other leave, the doctor concerned should complete such shortfall in order to become eligible to apply for the Selection Examination.

3. The applicants should be pass the selection examination to be eligible to be eligible for enrolment to the training programme. The current format of the selection examination is described in the MD(OMF Surgery) Prospectus 2011 , MD (Restorative Dentistry) Prospectus 2017 MD(Orthodontics) Prospectus 2013 and amendments attached with the prospectus.
4. The selection examination shall consist of **three components**.
 - i. **MCQ (SBA & MTF) - Paper I : 40 questions - 90 minutes**
- Paper II : 40 questions – 90 minutes

All candidates, (irrespective of the order of preferences) are required to sit for the MCQ component of the exam. In order to proceed for the next components (i.e., SEQ and OSCE/OSPE), a candidate should obtain the required pass mark for the MCQ component.

- ii. **Theory-SEQ (Paper I & II) – 02 hours for each paper**
- iii. **OSCE/OSPE - 20 stations**

The examination components shall be held and marked as stipulated amendment displayed in the PGIM website

5. 18 Candidates for Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery , 10 Candidates for Restorative Dentistry and 06 Candidates for Orthodontics from the **Ministry of Health (MOH)** who pass the selection examination will be enrolled in the training programme . Placements will be made purely in the order of merit . The details are available on the PGIM website under “General Regulations and Guidelines 2022”. **Candidates in sections 7, 8, 9, and 10 will have to obtain a mark similar or above to the last eligible MOH candidate to be offered a place in the training programme.**

6. The final number of available training placements will be determined based on the total number of candidates above the cut-off line.

7. All candidates attached to **Other Government Ministries** who pass the selection examination and are above the cut off line will be enrolled in the training programme in order of the merit.

8. All candidates from **State Universities** who pass the selection examination and are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.

9. All candidates from the **Armed Forces (including police)** who pass the selection examination and are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme in the order of merit.

10. All **Non -State Sector** candidates who are above the cut-off line will be enrolled in the training programme . They will be placed below the order of merit for candidates from the MOH , other government Ministries, State Universities and Armed Forces (including Police) based on merit within the non-state sector category.

11. The above number shall not be changes, nor shall requests for such changes to be entertained following the examination and after the release of results.

12. Each year only the scheduled Selection Examination in the approved examination calendar shall be held. No repeat or additional examinations will be held.

13. The allocation of training units will be done as described in “General Regulation & Guidelines 2022” which is available on PGIM website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk. The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons . The number of available subspeciality training vacancies offered for post MD training, if any, will be determined based on the vacancy list provided by th/e MOH prior to the allocation.

14. As per the PGIM regulation of 27.5.2020, the permitted number of attempts to six (06). The highest number of attempts they have sat either examination i.e. OMF Surgery, Restorative Dentistry, Orthodontics will be counted when preparing the merit order. However, the candidates will be allowed to sit the common selection examination 6 times.
15. When a candidate is selected, he/she should register in the same year. If a candidate fails to do so, another eligible candidate will be selected. Any candidate, who refuses to register in the current year, will not be permitted to register in the programme in a subsequent year with the same results unless a valid medical certificate from a consultant acceptable to the PGIM is submitted.
16. A fulltime release from the candidate's current employer i.e Ministry of Health, other government ministries, universities or by the armed forces is a prerequisite of enrollment in all fulltime training/ programmes. It may be necessary to sign a bond before such/ enrollment if it is required by the candidate's employer.
17. Post- MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of/ Board certification. The trainee status of trainees will be terminated in those who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by for (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training.
18. There should be no delay in submitting the research within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. Any delay will be added to the Board Certification.
19. The trainees must, within one (01) calendar month of satisfactory completion of the prescribed requirements, apply for Board certification. All relevant documents must be submitted with the application. Failure to do so will result in a delay of effective date of Board Certification.
20. Th/e candidate should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM web site.
21. The prescribed fees for the examination for candidates in the state sector are as follows:

(a) Registration fee	- Rs. 12,000.00 (non refundable)
(b) Examination fees	- Rs. 70,000.00
(c) Application Fee	- Rs. 6,000.00(non refundable)

(Candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Only online payment through the PGIM online portal will be accepted by the PGIM.

22. At the first instance Candidates are required to pay Rs. 12,000/= the registration fee. Rs. 6000/= application fee and Rs. 43,500/= as the examination fee for the MCQ paper. Those who qualify from the MCQ examination will be required to pay the balance examination fee of Rs. 26,500/= in order to proceed to the rest of the examination.
23. Th/e Application form can be downloaded from PGIM website (www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk)
24. The relevant information regarding the training programme and requirements for the Board certification are detailed in the MD (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery) Prospectus 2011, MD(Orthodontics) Prospectus 2013, MD (Restorative Dentistry) 2017 and the subsequent amendments published in the web-site.

25. All examination Applications and other documents are collected through a google form <https://forms.gle/H8zTgYYEX2WAQZkT6> on or before 10th January, 2023. All applicants should have a Gmail account to log in to the google form. You should attach your exam application with all the relevant documents as a single PDF document since this portal does not allow you to attach multiple documents. Please note **that incomplete, handwritten, late submissions and applications sent via e-mail will not be accepted.**
26. The selected candidates should report to the training units allocated to him/her within one month of receipt of the letter of selection to the training programme and allocation to the training unit.
27. Please refer the new regulations laid down by Ministry of Health regarding release of medical/dental officers of department of health- www.health.gov.lk/
28. The results will be valid and official after confirmation after Senate of the University.
29. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and **NOT** regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
30. The Candidates who will be selected to the MD (Orthodontics), MD(Restorative Dentistry), MD(OMF Surgery) training programmes should undergo the “Professionalism Ethics in Medical Practice Strand” organized by the PGIM. Please note that this is compulsory for all MD trainees and should be completed within the first two years of Pre MD- training. A certificate will be issued to trainees who complete this strand successfully.
31. The orientation programme on ‘PGIM library resources and services’ is mandatory for all postgraduate trainees who enter PGIM training programmes. Please refer library.pgim.cmb.ac.lk/ for more information.
32. A trainee following a PG certificate or PG Diploma or MSc od MD if the trainee leaves the course before completion of a programme/course of study, he/she shall not be permitted to sit for another selection examination for a minimum period of two years from the date of leaving the program/me course of study, this rule shall not be applied for online and parttime courses.
33. Candidates are requested to visit the PGIM website (www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk) for further updates.
