## MD (CLINICAL ONCOLOGY) PART II EXAMINATION – NOVEMBER 2024 (PROSPECTUS 2013)

- 1. The above examination will commence on Monday 18th November 2024
- 2. Applications are invited from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sitthe above examination.
  - (a) Successful completion of Part I Clinical Oncology examination.
  - (b) Participated and satisfactorily completed the Stage II Training programmes.
  - (c) Submission and acceptance of all progress reports and Peer Team Reviewreports. In case of unsatisfactory report/s from the trainer/s, the BOS / Clinical Oncology would take appropriate actions according to the PGIM General rules and regulations
  - (d) Submission of a case book 6 months prior to the date of commencementof the MD part 2 examination and acceptance of the same by the Board of Study in Clinical Oncology.

and

- (e) Should have completed Professionalism and Ethics in Medical PracticeStrand-(certificate to be submitted along with the application.)
- The MD (Clinical Oncology) Part II examination shall consist of seven components(labeled C1to C7) Covering the subjects in Clinical Oncology i.e
  - C1- Paper I Short Essay Type Question paper of 2 hrs duration
  - C2- Paper II Structured Essay Type Question paper of 3 hrs duration
  - C3- Paper III Structured Essay Type Question paper of 3 hrs duration

- C4- Clinicals -Long Case (45 minutes for examination and 30 minutesfor the the Discussion)
- C5- Clinicals -Short Cases (Two panels & 30 minutes each and minimum of three cases for candidate per each panel
- C6- Practical Treatment Planning (1 hour)
- C7- Viva voce 1 hour (2 panels. 30 minutes each.)
- 4. Pass mark of each component is 50% case
  - (i) A mark 50% or more is obtained in each of the sevencomponents of the examination. or
  - (ii) In the event that a score of 50% is not obtained for any one of the written components of the examination the candidate will beconsidered to have passed the examination if all the following criteriaare met.
    - a. An aggregate mark of 50% or more is obtained when the marks of all seven components are totaled
    - b. Has obtained a score of 50 % or more in each of the clinical components, long case, short cases, practical treatment planning and viva voce and,
  - c. Obtained a minimum mark of 45% in only one of the three written papers i.e., Paper I, II and III . The candidate should have scored 50% or more in the other components.

5. At the point of post MD allocation, the base specialty and any available subspecialties which are approved at the time of the post MD allocation will be offered to candidates, according to merit. The number of available base specialty and subspecialty training vacancies offered for Post MD training if any will be determined based on the vacancy list provided by the MOH prior to the post MD allocation.

6. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD Part II examination are required to be presentfor the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequentscheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.

7. Please note that the **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts to pass the MD (Clinical Oncology) part II examination which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of the first examination.** However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year of further training before permitted to the sixth attempt.

8. The allocation of post MD training units will be done as described in "General Regulations and Guidelines -2024" which is available on the PGIM web site <u>www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk</u> The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.

9. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification. The trainee status of trainees will be terminated in those who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training.

10. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for BoardCertification in Clinical Oncology shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.

11. Trainees could also be Board Certified with special training **in Paediatric - Oncology and Haemato - Oncology.** A trainee should have obtained prior board approval for such training after being successful at the MD (Clinical Oncology) Part II examination.

12. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.

13. The trainees must, within one (01) calendar month of satisfactory completion of the prescribed requirements, apply for Board Certification. All relevant documents must be submitted with the application. Failure to do so will result in a delay of the effective date of Board Certification.

14. The candidates should pass the Pre- Board Certification Assessment to be eligible forBoard Certification. The details are available on the PGIM website for perusal.
