MD (ORTHODONTICS) EXAMINATION SEPTEMBER 2025 (PROSPECTUS - 2013)

1. The above examination will commence on Monday **22nd September, 2025. The Examination will be held in the PGIM, Colombo.**
2. Applications are invited by me from dental officers possessing the following minimum requirements to sit the above examination.
 - a.) Satisfactory completion of 42 months of training as prescribed in the prospectus.
 - b.) Attendance according to the paragraph 10(leave) of the PGIM General Regulations and Guidelines for trainees 2025.
 - c.) Satisfactory pre-MD progress reports acceptable to the PGIM
 - d.) Satisfactory Multi source feedback (MSF) reports
 - e.) A Copy of the completed Case Book acceptable to the Board of Study, PGIM
 - f.) Passed the Mid Course Formative Assessment held during the pre-MD training
 - g.) Submission of the completed Log book along with the case book.
 - h.) All candidates who are eligible to sit the examination must submit **soft copy of the case book with** encompassing the treatment and management of 05 selected cases under the supervision of the Consultant Orthodontist and models relevant to the cases on or before 5th August, 2025. The case book will undergo plagiarism check by the PGIM.
 - i.) A certificate of the **Professionalism and Ethics in Medical Practice Strand organized by the PGIM should be submitted** along with the application.
3. The examination components are available as stipulated by the prospectus and subsequent amendments displayed in the PGIM web site.
4. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD (Orthodontics) examination are required to apply and sit for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.
5. Past question papers are available in the PGIM library website. <https://library.pgim.cmb.ac.lk/>
6. Please note that the candidates are allowed only six (06) attempts to pass the MD Examination which must be made within a period of eight (08) years from the date of the first Examination. However, after failing the fifth (05) attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year of further training before permitted to sit the sixth (06) attempt.

7. The Allocation of Post-MD training units will be done as described in “General regulations and guidelines- 2025” which is available on the PGIM website www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk and according to the approved procedures by the PGIM based on merit. The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.
8. Post-MD Trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the date of effective Board Certification. The trainee status of the trainees will be terminated in those who delay commencing overseas post MD Training more than (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training .
9. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
10. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, will be added to the effective date of Board Certification.
11. The trainees must, within one (01) calendar month of satisfactory completion of the prescribed requirements, apply for Board Certification. All relevant documents must be submitted with the application. Failure to do so will result in a delay of the effective date of Board Certification.
12. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available at the PGIM web site for perusal.
13. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows:-


(a) Registration fee	Rs.	15,500/= (Non Refundable)
(b) Examination fee	Rs.	138,000/=
(c) Application fee	Rs.	8,500/= (Non Refundable)
(d) Case Book Assessment	Rs	17,000/= (Non Refundable)

(candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

Note that only online payments through the PGIM online portal will be accepted

14. The application form could be downloaded from the website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk>
15. All examination applications and other documents are collected through a Google Form <https://forms.gle/7jCiTQF1wV4y3Bxh8> on or before 22nd August, 2025. Trainees have to use the email account created by the PGIM. The Exam application with all the relevant documents must be attached as a single PDF document since this portal does not allow uploading of multiple documents. **Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submissions and applications sent via email will not be accepted.**
16. The candidates will be issued an “**Examination Feedback Form**” with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (e.g. perceived biases, discriminatory behavior, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.

17. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
