# MD (ANAESTHESIOLOGY) FINAL EXAMINATION – SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER 2025 – (PROSPECTUS 2022)

- 1. The above examination will commence on 25<sup>th</sup> September 2025.
- 2. Applications are invited from medical officers possessing the following requirements to sit the above examination.
  - (a) Satisfactory completion of all clinical appointments prescribed in the training program as prescribed in prospectus 2022.
  - (b) Successful completion of 3 ARCPs.
  - (c) Completion of the eight (08) mandatory workshops/courses (listed in section 8 in prospectus 2022.)

and

(d) Should have completed Professionalism and Ethics in Medical Practice Strand- (certificate to be submitted along with the application.)

Note:-

(a) Candidates possessing recognized foreign specialist qualification/should make a formal application with documentations in order to be considered for exemption from the Selection examination and the Clinical training period, to sit the Final examination. Certified copies of the clinical appointments completed as prescribed in the regulations and the certified copies of primary/final examination certificates must be forwarded for scrutiny by the Board of Study.

- 3. The current format of the MD (Anaesthesiology) final examination is described in the Prospectus 2022 and amendments available in the PGIM website.
- 4. The MD (Anaesthesiology) examination shall consist of three components. ie Theory, OSCE and OSVE.

## 5. Requirements to pass the MD examination.

The final closed mark is obtained by adding the non-rounded off closed marks of the 3 components. (i.e. Theory, OSCE, OSVE). In order to pass the MD examination, the following criteria must be met.

Obtain a minimum non rounded off cumulative mark of nine (9)

#### **AND**

Obtain a non-rounded off closed mark of three (3) in at least two components.

### **AND**

Obtain a minimum closed mark of two (2) in all components.

### **AND**

Obtain a minimum closed mark of three (3) at four (4) out of seven (07) OSCE stations.

## 6. Re Sit Candidates

- A candidate who obtains a non-rounded off closed mark of **three** (3) or above and passes the **Theory component** (MCQ plus SEQ) of the examination but fails the overall examination will be exempted from the requirement to sit for the theory component for **one** subsequent attempt provided he/she obtains a minimum non rounded off closed mark of **two** (2) in the other 2 components (OSCE and OSVE).
- Theory component mark that would be carried over to a subsequent examination attempt stated above will be a close mark of *three* (3).
- If a candidate who passes the MCQ does not sit for the SEQ and/or OSCE and /or OSVE of same examination, the candidate will have to re sit the MCQ examination.
- When calculating the number of attempts, the first attempt at the MCQ will be considered as the first attempt at the exam.
- 7. At the point of post MD allocation, the base specialty and any available subspecialties which are approved at the time of the post MD allocation will be offered to candidates, according to merit. The number of available base specialty and subspecialty training vacancies offered for Post MD training if any will be determined based on the vacancy list provided by the Ministry of Health prior to the post MD allocation.

- 9. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD final examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination, or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examinations will be counted as attempts.
- 10. Please note that candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the final examination which must be made within a period of 8 years from the date of first examination. However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one-year further training before permitted to sit for the sixth attempt.
- 11. The allocation of training units will be done as described in "General Regulation & Guidelines 2025" which is available on PGIM website <a href="www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk">www.pgim.cmb.ac.lk</a> The allocated training unit/s shall not be changed for personal reasons.
- 12. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the effective date of Board Certification. The trainee status of trainees will be terminated in those who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training.
- 13. The minimum duration of post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
- 14. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is a delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
- 15. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available on the PGIM website for perusal.
- 16. The trainees must, within one (01) calendar month of satisfactory completion of the prescribed requirements, apply for Board Certification. All relevant documents must be submitted with the application. Failure to do so will result in a delay of the effective date of Board Certification.
- 17. The prescribed fees for the examination, shall be as follows:-

(a) Registration fee - Rs. 15,500/= (non refundable)

(b) Examination fees - Rs. 138,000/=

(c) Application fee - Rs. 8,500/= (non refundable)

(Candidates from non-state sector will be charged 50% more of the above listed fees)

## Note that only payments made through PGIM online portal will be accepted.

Candidates who exemption from sitting the written papers these candidates are required to submit a fresh application together with a letter wish to appear only for the clinical and oral components of the examination before the closing date of applications. Candidates who opt for the clinical and orals need to pay the Application fee Rs. **8,500.00** Registration fee of Rs. **15,500.00** and Rs. Rs. **69,500.00** as the examination fees.

- 19. All examination Applications and other documents are collected through a Google Form <a href="https://forms.gle/6fvDUeSL3kFaFMheAm">https://forms.gle/6fvDUeSL3kFaFMheAm</a>. on or before 12<sup>th</sup> September 2025. Trainees have to use the email account created by the PGIM. The exam application with all relevant documents must be attached as a single PDF document since this portal does not allow uploading of multiple documents. Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submission and application sent via email will not be accepted.
- 20. The candidates will be issued an "Examination Feedback Form" with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (e.g. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
- 21. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the Senate of the University.
