MD (HEALTH INFORMATICS) EXAMINATION – OCTOBER 2025
(PROSPECTUS 2015)

1. The above examination will commence on **15th October 2025**.
2. Applications are invited by me from Medical Officers/Dental Surgeon possessing the following requirements as specified in the Prospectus to sit the above examination :-
 - (i) Satisfactory progress in assigned local training.
 - (ii) Obtaining more than 50 marks for the Portfolio assessment.
 - (iii) Attendance according to Paragraph 10 (Leave) of the PGIM General Regulation and Guidelines for trainees 2025.
 - (iv) Certification by supervisors in all training units to which the trainee was attached that he/she has successfully completed training.
 - (v) Should submit a completed thesis.
 - (vi) Candidates are required to submit Professionalism & Ethics in Medical Practice Strand Certificate issued by the PGIM along with the application.
3. The examination consist of 3 components as follows: -
 - I. Written paper – 04 Essay questions to be answered in 3 hours
 - II. Viva voce examination based on the thesis
 - III. Viva voce examination based on the portfolio (Candidates who have scored more than 50 for portfolio assessment will be eligible to sit the examination)
4. In order to pass the MD Examination a candidate should obtain 50% (200 marks out of 400) or more for the written examination, 50% (200 marks out of 400) or more for the viva voce examination based on thesis and 50% (100 marks out of 200) or more for the viva voce examination based on the portfolio. The overall pass mark will be 50% (500 marks out of 1000)
5. Candidates who are eligible to sit the MD examination are required to be present for the first scheduled examination after completion of the training programme. If a candidate does not apply or does not sit the first scheduled examination or subsequent scheduled examinations for reasons not acceptable to the Board of Study, the examination will be counted as an attempt.

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6. Please note that **candidates are allowed only 6 attempts at the MD examination which must be completed within a period of 08 years from the date of the first examination.** However, after failing the fifth attempt the candidate should undergo a minimum period of one year further training before permitted to sit for the sixth attempt.
7. The allocation of post MD training units will be done as described in “General Regulations & Guidelines– 2025” and according to the approved procedure by the PGIM based on merit. **The allocated training units shall not be changed for personal reasons.**
8. Post-MD trainees should commence post-MD overseas training within two (02) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training. Any delay will be added to the date of effective Board Certification. Post-MD trainees who delay commencing overseas post-MD training by more than four (04) years after the expected date of completing local post-MD training will have their trainee status terminated.
9. There should be no delay in submitting the dissertation or research report within the stipulated period as prescribed in the prospectus. If there is delay, the Board Certification will be delayed accordingly.
10. The minimum duration of Post MD training required to be eligible for Board Certification shall be one year local and one year overseas. However, the duration may be more than two years in certain sub specialties and the information is available in the prospectus.
11. The candidates should pass the Pre-Board Certification Assessment to be eligible for Board Certification. The details are available on the PGIM website.
12. Following the completion of prescribed requirements for Board Certification including overseas training the prospective trainee applies for Board Certification with the relevant document within one month following the completion of such requirements. If this is not followed, the date of Board Certification will be delayed.
13. The prescribed fees for the examinations are as follows:

(a) Application fee	- Rs	8,500.00	(non refundable)
(b) Registration fee	- Rs.	15,500.00	(non refundable)
(c) Assessment fee	- Rs.	65,000.00	(non refundable)
(d) Examination fee	- Rs.	138,000.00	

(Note that the only payments made through the PGIM online portal will be accepted)
(Private candidates will be charged 50% more on each fee of the PGIM)

14. The application form can be downloaded from the website <http://pgim.cmb.ac.lk>.
15. All examination Applications and other documents will be collected through a Google Form. <https://forms.gle/6c67cXjK79coQZYs7> on or before **01st October 2025**. Candidates have to use the email accounts created by the PGIM to access the google form. The exam application with all the relevant documents must be attached as a **single PDF** document since this portal does not allow uploading of multiple documents. **Please note that incomplete, handwritten, late submission and application sent via email will not be accepted.**
16. The results will be valid and official after confirmation by the **Senate of the University of Colombo**.
17. The candidates will be issued an **“Examination Feedback Form”** with the admission documents. Feedback in Part II should be limited to concerns, if any, regarding the conduct of the examination (eg. perceived biases, discriminatory behaviour, harassment, intimidation) and NOT regarding the format or content of the examination. The form should be sent back to Director/PGIM under confidential cover **within 48 hours after conclusion of the examination. No concerns regarding the examination will be entertained after 48 hours of conclusion of the examination or following the release of results** nor will these be investigated by the PGIM.
